From the archives of Pastor Steve's messages:



Friends, it doesn't seem possible that the beginning of Lent was Ash Wednesday of this past week. At the Melester house, we have just gotten around to finally packing up all the Christmas decorations! Easter will soon be upon us. It begins on Palm Sunday, April 9th.

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the church season known as Lent. Lent is a time of preparation and reflection; it is a time of prayer and fasting; it is a time of pondering all that God, through His Son, our Savior Jesus, did for us. We prepare for the greatest truth the

world has ever known; the truth of the Easter story & the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. We prepare by going through a time of penitence and self-evaluation; but also a time of great gratitude for the love God has bestowed upon the world. As we prepare this Lenten season; let us reflect on, not only God's love for us, but also God's amazing grace!

I ask you to begin your Lenten journey by reflecting on the words of Michael Card:

HE WAS BORN TO DIE ---- so I could be born to new life!

HE SUFFERED TEMPTATION ---- so I can experience victory!

HE WAS BETRAYED ---- so I might know His faithfulness!

HE WAS ARRESTED AND BOUND ---- so I could be rescued from bondage!

HE WAS WOUNDED ---- so I could be healed!

HE ENDURED MOCKERY ---- so I could know dignity and joy!

HE WAS CONDEMNED ---- so the truth could set me free!

HE WAS NAILED TO THE CROSS ---- so I might escape judgment!

HE WAS STRETCHED OUT BETWEEN TWO THIEVES ---- so I could know the reach of love!

From a branch on the Vine,

1500 years ago, the church, the universal (catholic) body of Christ, constructed a statement of the Christian faith, the Apostles' Creed. Legend says each of the Apostles wrote a line, however all of them had already received their reward in Heaven by the time the creed was formed. It was the early church Fathers of the 4th and 5th century who saw the need to have a simple proclamation of our faith for new converts and to ward off distortions of the gospel. Early on, the Apostles' Creed - the affirmation of the faith we profess each Sunday - was used as preparation before baptism on Easter Sunday. What is the value for us, today?

For me, it draws focus to the truth; frames the way I should live; and provides an answer to those who ask where my joy comes from. It begins with two simple words, *I believe* – not like I believe the Redskins will win the Super Bowl - hopeful wishes, but in these words are the absolute truth that time and culture cannot diminish. This is a cornerstone of truth I can stand on and grow from.



As a foundation, the statements of faith shape my actions in a world that is becoming more self-absorbed and less compassionate. I am to be a steward of this world because God created it. I am not to be judgmental because it is Jesus who will judge the quick (living) and the dead. I know the Holy Spirit is real and will guide me; and I share in a fellowship with all followers of Christ, living with me and living with Him. I need forgiveness and I need to forgive. I do not fear, for one day, I will be resurrected with an imperishable body to be with all the heavenly hosts in the presence of my Lord.

The Apostles' Creed is also a witness to what I am as a disciple of Christ. What sustains me? How can I remain hopeful? What do I believe?

I believe in God the Father Almighty and in Jesus Christ, His only Son who was crucified and rose on the third Day. I believe in the Holy Spirit; Christ's body - the church; the bond with all the saints; forgiveness; and being raised to be with God forever.

Do you believe?

Do you voice these statements as an outward sign of your faith in Christ or is it recitation? Are these wishful words or are you confident these are the timeless truths?

To be certain, there is *infinitely* more to our relationship with the Triune God. The Apostles' Creed is a solid foundation. If you would like to explore further this affirmation of faith, beginning Monday, March 6th, a Lenten study based on Adam Hamilton's book, **Creed, What Christian's Believe and Why**, will be offered in the Fellowship Hall. The six-session study will be Monday evenings at 7:00pm and Wednesday mornings at 10:00am. Books are available in the Social Hall.

Lent is here – reflect on your relationship with God, seek repentance and transformation, and prepare your heart for the way of the Lord. He will come again.

And the life everlasting. Amen.

Faith and Health Corner

March 2017

Brain Injury

Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind."

~ Matthew 22:37 NIV

Your brain is one of the most important organs in your body since it coordinates all of the body's functions and thought processes. Without it you couldn't walk to the store, read your grocery list, count out your change, or hide the chocolate when you get home from the store. It controls involuntary actions such as the beating of your heart and voluntary actions like dialing a phone. A traumatic brain injury (TBI) can happen to anyone and create many challenges for families living with TBI.

Those at highest risk are children 0 - 4 years old, 15 - 19 year olds, and military personnel. Although many injuries come from risk-taking activities such as sky diving or race car driving, many stem from normal actions of work and play like driving a car, playing a sport, or falling at home. Long term effects of TBI include problems with memory, managing emotions, and risk of brain disorders in later years.

Decreasing the chance of an injury is easy with some basic safety practices. Wear seat belts to cut down on head injuries in the event of an accident. Have your children wear helmets when they ride bikes or rollerblades. Remove the clutter or throw rugs in the homes of your parents and older adults to prevent falls. A simple fall or blow to the head in any of these situations can cause severe complications requiring months or even years of rehabilitation with no quarantee of recovery.

If an injury does occur, watch the victim for signs of blurred vision, confusion, a severe headache, or repetition of questions or statements after the fall. Contact a doctor or visit the emergency room to determine the severity of the injury. Additional serious signs of a TBI might include violent vomiting, seizures or even loss of consciousness. As with other conditions, a timely visit to the emergency room is essential for long term health.

FAITH SEEKERS CLASS

As we've started our recent study on discipleship, the importance of relationships has come into focus. One theme from the book that has stood out is that God can and does use every situation and every relational interaction to disciple us. Regardless of the relationship, whether with friends, coworkers, complete strangers, family, even our children, God uses that interaction, that moment, to make us more like Christ.

It's often said that out of the mouths of babes comes wisdom. While that phrase is not literally found in Scripture, this half-truth highlights what many a parent has realized. Kids have a remarkable way of stating biblical truth. I witnessed this recently with something Zoey did. In our kitchen is a small chalkboard with the phrase, "I love you because..." In the only time she has written on the board, she added "because you love me too." When I read it, I couldn't help but think of 1 John 4:19, "We love because He first loved us."

Zoey had unknowingly pointed to a greater truth in that simple statement. She loves us because we first loved her, just as we love others as God showed us how to love. 
