I am a big Max Lucado fan. Max is the pastor of Oak Hills Church in San Antonio, Texas and is a talented and prolific author of many Christian books. His writing style speaks to me and I have quoted him often. In his new book, entitled "Glory Days" he speaks of the enemy of Christianity. Here is an offering from the book. I think it speaks to our challenges in the church and in our beloved country,

"The idea of an actual devil strikes many people as odd and outdated. The popular trend of our day is to blame problems on genetics, governments, and environments. Yet the Bible presents a real and present foe of our faith. His name is Satan. Some call him the devil. Others call him Beelzebub, Belial, the obstructor, the tempter, the evil one, the accuser, the prince of demons, the ruler of this world, or the prince of the power of the air. Whatever name you choose, he is the enemy, and he is real."

It is believed, based upon Isaiah 14: 12-17 and several other Biblical references, that Satan is a fallen angel. That Satan wanted to be God and because of this great sin was cast out of heaven. Without getting into a long dissertation, I want to suggest to you that whatever the reason that Satan exists, whatever the reason that evil exists --- Satan and evil are real and they are the enemy we face. 1 Peter tells us, "The devil, your enemy, goes around like a roaring lion looking for someone to eat." John 10:10 says there are three things that Satan loves to do: "To steal, and to kill, and to destroy."

"Our fight (The Apostle Paul tells us in Ephesians 6:12-16) is not against people on earth but against the rulers and authorities and powers of this world's darkness, against the spiritual powers of evil in the heavenly world. That is why you need to put on God's full armor. Then on the day of evil you will be able to stand strong. And when you have finished the whole fight, you will be standing! So stand strong with the belt of truth tied around your waist and the protection of right living on your chest. On your feet wear the Good News of peace to help you stand strong. And also use the shield of faith with which you can stop all the burning arrows of the Evil One." Eph. 6:12-16 NCV

Friends, no matter what evil is lurking around the corner, no matter what spirit of disunity is causing chaos, no matter what liar is causing dissention, no matter what accuser is creating judgment, no matter what tempter is making bad things look good, no matter what this king of all liars is trying to accomplish --- Satan has already been defeated! Praise be to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! On the cross of Calvary, the devil was "kicked to the curb" and through the power and promise of the resurrection, Satan, that old devil, has been totally defeated and one day will be utterly destroyed. The glory of Easter means many things but let us never forget --- it means evil will not win! Death will not win! Sin will not win! We have victory and that victory is through our Lord Jesus Christ!!!!

I pray this season of Lent has been a meaningful journey for each and every one of you and I hope that this upcoming Holy Week will stimulate renewed discipleship. I pray and hope that this Easter will be the very best for you and your loved ones and that you can embrace the truth and the promise and the power of the resurrection!!! Let me close with this mantra from Rev. Lucado's book: "These days are glory days. My past is past, my future is bright, God's promises are true and His Word is sure. With God as my helper, I will be all he wants me to be, do all he wants me to do, and receive all he wants me to receive. These days are Glory Days!"

FAITH SEEKERS CLASS

If vs. When

Anyone with children will tell you kids are skilled negotiators. They are masters of using the word 'if.' It doesn't matter what you're discussing; chores, what's for dinner, bedtime. You know what words kids won't use when negotiating? When. It implies certainty. If allows an out. This is the difference between how we think and God speaks.

In Luke, we are confronted with two men of very similar circumstances. Both are guilty of crimes and sentenced to die on a cross. When they meet Jesus however, they have strikingly different reactions. The first wants to keep his independence, even unto the end. He makes his acceptance conditional, saying "… If thou be Christ, save thyself and us" (Luke 23:39). In contrast, the second criminal was at the end of himself. No negotiation, no false pretenses, just a simple prayer, pleading "… Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom" (Luke 23:42).

We often say, when talking about gas prices, interest rates, or bad luck, that it's not a matter of if, but when. But what if (and I realize I just said if), we apply the same logic to our daily walk? Not if I help the poor, but when. Not if I share my testimony, but when. What a change we would see in ourselves and in the world. Are you ready to say to your heart, it's not a matter of if, but when?

It is the desire of BFUMC to begin a Witness Team, in earnest, and to find a chairperson or persons who will work initially with the pastor and staff to develop this team. 



From a branch on the Vine,

What do you do? I don't mean as in, "What do you do with a dead skunk in your yard? Properly dispose of it? Give it as a special gift to your neighbor? Ignore it and hope the buzzards are desensitized." I mean: what do you do with Jesus? That's Lent in a nutshell – a time to do some soul-searching about your relationship with the Son of God.

The disciple Thomas was not present when Jesus first appeared to the other disciples behind the locked doors of the upper room. The second time he was there, and exclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" Then





On Easter morning, we proclaim victory because Jesus came to us, died in our place, and atoned to the Father for the sins of His children. In praise, we say He is alive. He who prompted Thomas to cry out and the disciples to realize who broke bread with them is still at work in the world and **in** His children. It is still an offer of hope born of love. What do you do?

Everyone has doubts. Everyone can be blind to the Savior that is right before them. For those who declare My Lord and My God, they are changed – not to perfection, but they are kinder, gentler, more forgiving, less critical, mindful of those that struggle. There is more love in them and more love they live out. Is that you? In each moment you have the choice to be like Christ to others and to yourself. You can have hope, love, peace and purpose. Please don't confuse these promised gifts with a life without difficulty. It is a promise that you will overcome the difficulties our broken world brings.

I have my doubts – about my effectiveness as a Youth Director; about the jobs I do at church; about my purpose at this moment in time. This Lent is also my time to soul-search. Am I doing what God is asking? Am I still intentionally seeking God and the works of His Kingdom? I wish I could say it is always well with my soul (it isn't). I **can** say I am changed because of Jesus Christ, and He is still doing a great work of my life.

I marvel at the faith of others, as if their life is one long blessing. How can they radiate joy? Don't they have trouble somewhere in their life? I know they do, but, in their struggle, they cry out, My Lord and My God. In their burdens, they see Jesus revealed. I want that in my life. This Lent, that is what I am going to do with Jesus. I will reclaim Him as My Lord and My God, and I will look for Him in each moment where He will reveal Himself. This season, I am remembering what it feels like to be in awe of God who has already decided what to do with me – forgive me, love me, bring me home.
