I look so forward to serving alongside each of you during this most special time of year!!!!



Faith Seekers Class

The Faith Seekers class has been working through a study by Kyle Idleman entitled *Not a Fan*. The accompanying video follows Eric, a man who is transformed from a fan to a follower by his encounter with Jesus. On the heels of a recent mission trip, we watched a segment where Eric is confronted by his wife regarding the significant changes he was making in his life. The changes were affecting the family, and she wondered what influence she had in the direction Eric was steering their family. A similar question was put to the folks who had gone on the mission trip. What if your spouse had questioned your decision to go? What if he or she counseled against it, pointing to the numerous responsibilities at home? What would you do?

I wrestled with this question for some time, though deep down I knew the answer. When Jesus calls we are faced with a choice, which is not really a choice at all. We can answer the call to follow, as Peter and Andrew did when Jesus said "Follow me," or we can refuse. There is no other option.

The refusal of his call comes in many forms. At times, we try to present terms to Jesus for our following, believing it leaves an out if this one-sided contract is not honored. Or we procrastinate, finding excuses not to follow. Like the individuals in Luke 9, we say to Jesus, "First let me go" or "Let me first."

We may think Jesus is being unreasonable in what he is asking us to do, to follow him, and the truth is that he is being unreasonable. He was also unreasonable when he took on our sins, my sins, suffering the pain and humiliation of the cross so we wouldn't have to. Reason tells us that God would not stoop so low as to meet us in the mire and muck of this world, yet He did. When Jesus calls, it is not a request. He does not ask, "When you are ready, go rebuild a home for the family without one." He doesn't ask, "If you have time in your busy schedule, please go feed the hungry."

There is a quote from a wise philosopher, "Do or do not. There is no try." I feel this is often how we feel about following Jesus. We "try." But the call of Jesus is to follow or not follow. We either are following Jesus, or we are not. There is no middle ground. When Jesus calls us to action, we either drop our nets like Peter and Andrew, or we don't. To borrow an old idiom, when Jesus says jump, we don't ask how high. We either jump or we keep our feet on the ground.

Returning to the earlier question, I knew the answer. Jesus calls and we respond. Our answer can be affirmative or it can be negative. But make no mistake, an answer is required. It is either immediate action or it is not. There is no middle ground. To do is to follow. To delay is to 'do not.' There is no try. The choice to go did not belong to me, nor did it belong to my wife. I am not called to do nothing. I am not called to try. I am called to do. I am called to follow.

To answer Jesus' call is not her choice, nor it is mine. The choice is not a choice at all. When Jesus calls, I am to follow. I am not called to do nothing. I am not called to try. I am called to do. I am called to follow.

CCAP is located at 112 and 106 S. Kent Street.

OCTOBER CCAP DAY THANK YOU! Our congregation collected a valuable donation on our October CCAP Day. These donations will help fill the clothes bins at CCAP and clothe clients in need. For the men - We collected 56 T-shirts, 88 pair of socks, 5 pair of underwear, 2 thermals, and 2 shorts. For the women - We collected 55 pair of underwear, 48 pair of socks, and 2 bras. These items will be of great use to our CCAP clients. On behalf of the Outreach committee, CCAP and those receiving these gifts, Thank You!!

October 19th was the 4th Quarter Business Meeting for CCAP. Here are some notes and volunteer requests from the meeting:

- CCAP is always in need of men's clothing; especially jeans, underwear, socks, and t-shirts.
- Volunteers that are comfortable using a computer are needed to sign-in clients.
- Volunteers are needed on Mondays in the clothing house. The hours are 8:30 to noon.
- Volunteers are needed to drive the van for food pickups. As much as 1700# of food will be loaded and unloaded. Contact Frances at 540-313-1997 if you can help one day a week.
- Volunteers are needed to help split, load and unload wood for CCAP clients.
- Contributions for our homeless clients: there is always a need for sandwiches, pull ring food cans and snacks. Contact Frances or me if you would like to provide these items.
- The office can always use 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 white paper and Staples rewards coupons.
- The RED WAGON ministry gave out 33,129 diapers in the 3rd quarter. Diapers, especially the large sizes, are needed. The baby room needs coats with hoods, snowsuits, socks, underwear and baby accessories. The clothes should be new or gently used.
- The Thanksgiving Food Giveaway is on **Saturday**, **November 18**th, **8:30 to Noon**. Last year over 700 families were served. Individuals and youth groups are invited to come on that Saturday and help clients carry goods to their cars.

Collections for CCAP at Burnt Factory UMC – November is a busy month for CCAP collections! We will continue our traditional giving to CCAP as follows:

- **Thanksgiving Food** for the giveaway on November 18th. Sign-up sheets for non-perishable food and turkeys will be on the Sign-up Table October 29 November 12.




From a Branch on the Vine

It is within reach; so close you can feel it; just around the next bend. The fulfillment of God's promises is coming; the hope of God's people is in the faith that God keeps His promises.

When Moses led the Hebrew people out of slavery in Egypt to the Promised Land – the land He promised to Abraham – they arrived after two years to the doorstep of their destination. It was just over the hill. Men from each of the tribes were sent out to explore the land; after 40 days, they gave their report:

"We went into the land to which you sent us, and it does flow with milk and honey! Here is its fruit. ²⁸ But the people who live there are powerful, and the cities are fortified and very large.



For two years the people had been travelling a long barren road – complaining, yet still being sustained by a faithful God. Each day Moses and the leaders had told the people of the beautiful destination to be given to them by God. They had arrived. Why did it take another 38 years to take possession of God's gift?

³¹ But the men who had gone up with him said, "We can't attack those people; they are stronger than we are." **Numbers 13:27-31**

They stopped trusting God.

The challenges may be daunting, but are they stronger than God? The people's fear, in spite of witnessing the miraculous signs, was based on what they could accomplish on their own compared to what God could do. Is what lies ahead for us stronger than God? Will we stop short of the Promised Land, our inheritance from God, because we are afraid?

Burnt Factory has steadily grown and blossomed in ministry. Because we are better? I wouldn't say that. Let us just say God has blessed us by His means for His purpose. Do you think that blessing is over? I am completely convinced God is still working out His purpose. He is using the words and actions of Burnt Factory as an instrument to share the love of Jesus Christ. Do we believe this? Are things the way they used to be? They never will be. Does God love us? He always will! Do we need to obey the leading of the Holy Spirit – Yes! By God's power, we will be successful; by our power (and with our fear), we will fail.

Joshua and Caleb said to the entire Israelite assembly, If the Lord is pleased with us, he will lead us into that land, a land flowing with milk and honey, and will give it to us. Only do not rebel against the Lord. And do not be afraid of the people of the land, because we will devour them. Their protection is gone, but the Lord is with us. Do not be afraid of them." Numbers 14:6-9

¹⁹ Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, his body, ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, ²⁵ not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.


The Center will be moving into their new facility after the New Year Holiday! What a joy and blessing.
