Prayer Partners for 2018


This year's prayer partners will be revealed at our Dec. 14 UMW meeting. At that time, we will also draw names for our 2018 prayer partners.



December 2017 CCAP Corner

CCAP, the Congregational-Community Action Project, is a cooperative ministry of 45 area churches and one synagogue serving Winchester and Frederick County that have joined together to provide financial, material and supportive assistance to people in need. CCAP is located at 112 and 106 S. Kent Street.

Thank you so much for your generous donations for the Thanksgiving food collection. We were able to supply enough food for 16 complete Thanksgiving dinners for CCAP.

We also donated an additional 10 turkeys. The food was distributed to CCAP clients the Saturday before Thanksgiving so they could prepare a meal for their families.

On November 22nd, to continue our tradition of a Thanksgiving Eve offering, we collected 38 new blankets for the CCAP Christmas Giveaway and 2685 diapers, 3 teething rings, 2 pacifiers and 2152 wipes for The Red Wagon Ministry. Again, we graciously thank you for your wonderful giving to two important ministries serving those struggling to stay warm and diaper their children.

In September and October of this year, the Outreach committee did a trial run of serving lunch one Sunday a month at CCAP. The trials went well and on average we served 25 homeless clients at these lunches. We prepared the lunches ahead and 6-7 volunteers from church helped serve the meals outside of the main CCAP Building. We started the set-up at 12:15 and served from 12:30 to 1:30. We would like to continue this mission and have chosen the third Sunday of each month as our Sunday to reach out to these homeless clients. We have set-up three different serving teams so each team will only serve 4 times a year. Please contact me if this is a mission you would like to be part of. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to join us. Our next lunch will be served on Sunday, December 17th.

As 2017 comes to a close, The Outreach Committee would like to extend our sincere thanks to each of you for supporting CCAP through your generous donations, volunteering and prayers. Your kindness reaches a lot of people. We will never truly know how many lives we have touched.

From a branch on the Vine

The season of Advent, four Sundays before Christmas, is preparation for the coming of the Messiah, Emmanuel, God with skin on – expecting the glory of God in a form we can relate to. God comes to us to save us from our own brokenness. An exciting time is here in this Christmas season.

⁸ And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to



them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." 

12 Ways

To Have a Healthy Holiday Season

Brighten the holidays by making your health and safety a priority. Take steps to keep you and your loved ones safe and healthy - and enjoy the Christmas season.

- 1. Wash hands often to help prevent spreading germs. It's flu season. Wash your hands with soap and clean running water for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. Bundle up to stay warm and dry. Wear appropriate outdoor clothing: light, warm layers, gloves, hats, scarves, and waterproof boots.
- 3. Manage stress. Give yourself a break if you feel stressed out, overwhelmed, and out of control. Some of the 🦉 best ways to manage stress are to find support, connect socially, and get plenty of sleep.
- 4. Don't drink and drive or let others drink and drive. Whenever anyone drives drunk, they put everyone on the road in danger. Choose not to drink and drive and help others do the same.
- 5. Be smoke-free. Avoid smoking and secondhand smoke. Smokers have greater health risks because of their tobacco use, but nonsmokers also are at risk when exposed to tobacco smoke.
- 6. Fasten seat belts while driving or riding in a motor vehicle. Always buckle your children in the car using a child safety seat, booster seat, or seat belt according to their height, weight, and age. Buckle up every time, no matter how short the trip and encourage passengers to do the same.
- 7. Get exams and screenings. Ask your health care provider what exams you need and when to get them. Update your personal and family history. Get insurance from the Health Insurance Marketplace (Healthcare.com Marketplace) if you are not insured.
- 8. Get your vaccinations. Vaccinations help prevent diseases and save lives. Everyone 6 months and older should get a flu vaccine every year.
- 9. Monitor children. Keep potentially dangerous toys, food, drink, household items, and other objects out of children's reach. Protect them from drowning, burns, falls, choking, and other potential accidents.
- 10. Practice fire safety. Most residential fires occur during the winter months, so don't leave your Christmas lights on or fireplaces, space heaters, food cooking on stoves or candles unattended. Have an emergency plan in place and practice it regularly.
- 11. Prepare food safely. Remember these easy steps: Wash hands and surfaces often, avoid cross-contamination cook foods to proper temperatures and refrigerate foods promptly.
- 12. Eat healthy, stay active. Eat fruits and vegetables which pack nutrients and help lower the risk for certain diseases. Limit your portion sizes and foods high in fat, salt, and sugar. Also, be active for at least $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours a week and help kids and teens be active for at least 1 hour each day.

I hope that some of these tips will be helpful to you as we enter the Christmas season, but above all please remember that Jesus is the Reason for the Season. Relax, spend time with friends and family, listen to Christmas carols, fill your heart with all the love it can hold and spread joy all around.


GET CREATIVE. DIY projects are a great way to be festive and save money. Crafts that come from the heart are often more cherished than any box of stuff that you would buy at the store.
