Friends, we have been given a great opportunity! Our neighbor, directly across the street from the church, came to me back in early December with an offer. She said she was selling her property and that it was her desire that the church have the first chance to purchase it.

I took this information to the Church Council and at our January meeting, they gave permission for the various committees to pursue investigating and to entering into all due diligence regarding what would be involved in purchasing the property. The property that is listed as 1934 Jordan Springs Road consists of 15 acres and a beautiful brick home that dates to 1801. Upon inspection by several knowledgeable members of the church, the house was found to be in wonderful condition for its age, clean, and well kept. The property contains a beautiful pond with a running creek and several various out-buildings. The asking price is \$395,000.

As a church, we are under certain guidelines in pursuing the purchase of property. One of those guidelines is obtaining the approval of the District Committee on Church Locations & Buildings, which serves as an arm of the Virginia Annual Conference of the UMC. This committee, which is chaired by our District Superintendent, Rev. Larry Thompson, unanimously approved the financial plan we brought forth. Having secured that approval, the next step is calling and convening a Church Conference. A Church Conference is where the entire professing membership of the church has voice and vote. You -- the church -- will discern and decide whether the purchase of this property is what God desires for our future at BFUMC and whether this purchase helps us to fulfill the mission of the church.

On March 12 at 7:00 in our sanctuary, Rev. Larry Thompson will preside over our called Church Conference for the purpose of voting on whether to purchase this property and approve of additional indebtedness or not. This is your opportunity to make your discernments known. Our finance team will make a presentation and we will hear from several in leadership.

I want to make this very clear. If we decide to purchase this property, we will do so in faith that God will present a vision for its use. I can think of a 100 uses for this property, as I am sure many of you can, but we have not discerned what a specific plan will be for its use at this time. We have, quite simply, not had the time. We are in the process of forming a new Long Range Planning Team that will be tasked with visioning and discerning our future in all areas of growth. In any event, I encourage you to take part in this process. A majority vote will win the day but quite frankly, as we have instituted in the past, I would like to see a consensus of at least 85% one way or the other. This is your church! Come and be a part of this decision, come and hear the financial plan, come and be a part of this special time in the life of Burnt Factory UMC!

On behalf of The Laurel Center I would like to thank you for your generous gift of personal hygiene & household items, journals, and clothing. Your commitment to helping victims and survivors of domestic and sexual violence in our community is sincerely appreciated.

Each year The Laurel Center continues to advance its mission of ending sexual and domestic violence in our community. As staff, we have seen many lives changed for the better through our emergency shelter and counseling programs. The following are examples of what women said after using our support services:

- I learned to be independent, take care of myself, obtain a job and make wiser choices.
- I learned to set boundaries for myself, got a place and got on with my life.
- I obtained housing and employment and learned self-care and safety skills.
- I learned that when my kids witness violence in my home it can make them sad. What I choose to tolerate reflects on my child.

Our goal is to continue to make a difference in the lives of those who are suffering because of domestic violence or sexual assault. We don't want anyone to give up. With the help of donations from supporters such as you we continue to meet this problem head on. We believe all people have the right to live without violence or the fear of violence.

How Walk to Emmaus Can Benefit Congregations

To this end, Emmaus provides a means by which people gain a lively overview of Christian Faith, encounter the risen Christ in Christian community and experience a rekindling of the gift of God's Love in their hearts." A plan of disciplined follow-through (called Reunion Groups), is an effective means of changing church members into effective disciples of Christ and plant seeds of renewal in congregations. In many other churches, Emmaus Graduates become Sunday school teachers, project and committee leaders, and mission volunteers. In Burnt Factory UMC, we already had leaders in place who have not attended Emmaus Retreat and are doing a GREAT JOB! We also have Emmaus Graduates who are already in leadership positions — Pastor Steve and Melanie Melester, Rev. Jay and Harriett Hanke, Stephen Cunningham, Carrie Fair, Jason & Kalyn Corron, Tim Heinlein, and Sue and I. Other Emmaus Graduates include Bruce and Bonnie Rogers, Phil Shobe, and Sonny Sibert. Paige Rogers is a Chrysalis Graduate.

Emmaus Graduates have a mission of selecting others (called Sponsoring) to attend future Walk to Emmaus Retreats. Sponsoring may be a shared responsibility like one family paying for the Retreat Fees, and another transporting Pilgrims to and from the Retreats. We think Pilgrims are special people so we take them to a meal before and after their Retreat. We also depend on church members to provide us with recommendations on who should attend future Retreats, and we have our Pastor Steven Melester approve all attendees. We are looking for Attendees now. All Pilgrims selected need to fill out an application and pay a \$25.00 fee with their application (made out to Loudoun Valley Emmaus).



While many World War II veterans reported how the original book carried them through difficult days and years following the war, it was underestimated how much the pocket-sized books would be appreciated today.



CCAP is located at 112 and 106 S. Kent Street.

Our next CCAP collection will be for <u>Children's Easter Baskets</u> and will run March 11 through March 18. A sample basket will be located in the Fellowship Hall. Baskets should be appropriate for children ages infant through 12 years. Please package your basket in plastic wrap and include such items as: SIDEWALK CHALK, BUBBLES, JUMP ROPES, SMALL STUFFED ANIMALS, MATCHBOX CARS, PLAYDOH, BOOKS, COLORING BOOKS, CRAYONS, MARKERS, STORYBOOKS, BUG BUCKETS, APPROPRIATE SMALL TOYS AND SNACKS. Please limit the amount of candy. All candy should be in its original wrapping. The baskets will be given away at CCAP on Saturday, March 24th from 8:30am – noon. Everyone is welcome to come help distribute the baskets on the 24th.

MAUNDY THURSDAY SERVICE – We will be continuing our Maundy Thursday tradition of collecting diapers for the Red Wagon Ministry at CCAP. In 2017, this Ministry gave out well over 100,000 diapers and had 3206 visits. All diaper sizes are appreciated, but the Ministry is most in need of size 5 diapers.

Keep in mind the days you'll have time to cook and the days that you'll be pressed for time, then make a grocery list and stick to it. Buy in-season fruits and vegetables. Purchase canned and frozen fruits and vegetables when fresh ones are not available or affordable. They're healthy too, and will last longer. Never shop for food when you're hungry! Review store ads and clip coupons before shopping. Stock up on sale items you can use in a timely manner. Look for items on the top and bottom shelves in the grocery store. The most costly brands are often place at eye-level. Assemble snacks at home in small baggies and use foods such as nuts, low-fat cheese, and fresh fruits and vegetables, rather than buying less healthy and more expensive packaged and processed snacks. Use your food budget wisely. For the price of a large bag of chips and a box of cookies, you can buy a lot of apples, bananas, carrots, celery and other healthy foods.


