From our Pastor

One of the many challenges to the church today is overcoming the great harm some churches have perpetrated upon the people. As the post-Christian culture of our country continues to grow and intensify, believers are left with daunting circumstances, declining attendance, apathetic participation, lack of Godly leaders and a general mis-trust of the church and its leaders. How do we begin to overcome the "ungrace" some faith communities have practiced? How do we start in motion a true apostolic revival? I believe this article from Pastor Carey Nieuwhof shines a little light on one aspect for our consideration.

"I understand that the idea of the church being imperfect makes some people despair. But rather than making us despair, the fact that Jesus started the church with imperfect people should make us marvel at God's incredible grace. That God would use ordinary, broken human beings as vessels of his grace, and delight in it is awe-inspiring. He's proud of how his grace is beating through your imperfect-but-redeemed life and through the church. The idea that God would use you and me is pretty amazing. He had other options. He could have spoken to the world directly, but instead chose to use broken people to showcase his grace to a world in need of redemption.

For sure, community is messy. People sin. Leaders are sinful. Most of the New Testament is not a story of an idealized church where everything worked perfectly all the time (just read 1 Corinthians any time you're frustrated with your church). Most of the New Testament is a story of Jesus using his followers to spread his love in spite of themselves and as they overcome obstacle after obstacle. The fact that Christ uses flawed people to accomplish his work on earth is actually a sign of his grace, not a sign of his absence.

The church's story, as twisted as it gets at times, is a beautiful story of God's grace, God's power and God's redemption. So, by the way, is your life, which reflects the story of the church more than you would want to admit. The church gives the world a front row seat to the grace of God."

Words that are worth pondering! The heart of Wesleyan theology and Methodist practice is grace!

# Faith and Health Corner June 2018

He has shown you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with God. Micah 6:8

June is the month that we celebrate Father's Day. It's a great time to give thanks for all of our fathers and to let them know that June is also Men's Health Month.

Recognizing and preventing men's health problems is not just a man's issue. It impacts everyone in their family. Women are 100% more likely than men to visit the doctor for annual exams and preventive services. 1 in 2 men are diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime compared to 1 in 3 women. In 2010, there were 88.9 men for every 100 women in the 65 - 69 age group.

Here are three tips to get all of you men started toward a healthy month, a healthy year, and a healthy lifetime:

- 1. Eat Healthy Start by taking small steps like saying no to super-sizing and yes to a healthy breakfast. Eat many different types of foods to get all the vitamins and minerals you need. Add at least one fruit and vegetable to every meal.
- 2. Get Moving Play with your kids or grandkids. Take the stairs instead of the elevator. Do yard work. Play a sport. Keep comfortable walking shoes handy at work and in the car. Most importantly, choose activities that you enjoy to stay motivated.
- 3. Make Prevention a Priority Many health conditions can be detected early with regular checkups from your healthcare provider. Regular screenings may include blood pressure, cholesterol, glucose, prostate health and more.

As your Faith Community Nurse, I am here to serve as a bridge to better health, meeting the wholistic healing mission of the church by partnering with the Pastor as a healer of the spirit, mind and body.





We didn't have a regular meeting in May, but several of us got the school kits ready for Pastor Steve to take to conference. We had supplies for 51 kits and have some 2 inch erasers and a few pencils left over to start next year's stash. When the summer sales are going on (July and August), that is a good time to pick up the spiral notebooks (70 pages), rulers (centimeter), blunt children's scissors, box of 24 crayons, and pencil sharpeners. It takes over 300 unsharpened pencils for the number of kits we prepare, so pick those up, too. Thanks for being a frugal shopper for these items. The sessions begin Father's Day, the 17<sup>th</sup>, through Thursday, the 21<sup>st</sup>. Time: 6:00 – 8:30 p.m.

Debbie Moss will be our program leader and Susie Gerometta and Martha Ludtke will serve refreshments. We will also collect our annual World Thank offering at this meeting. We will review our <u>Living Into Our Purpose</u> check sheet to see how we are doing. Sometimes you are unaware of the good things your unit does until they are recorded.

**June 6<sup>th</sup> Senior High** are invited to pastor Steve's house from 6:00 to 7:00 pm for a Wednesday evening get-together.




**June 13<sup>th</sup> Junior High** are invited to the Youth Cottage for our Wednesday evening get-together from 6:00 to 7:00 pm.

### About the Conference

Today 9% of Americans are suffering from moderate to severe depression. This means that it is very likely that you or someone you know has a depressive disorder. Unfortunately, most people will not seek the services of a physician, counselor or minister because they don't know what depression is or how much can be done for it.

To learn more about the symptoms, causes and treatments of depression, plan to attend a halfday seminar on Saturday, June 23, 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon. This seminar will examine the biological, psychological and spiritual aspects of depression. Dr. White will also share about his own depression and healing. There will be time for questions and answers during and after the presentation.

A free will offering will be taken to support the teaching Dr. White does twice yearly in Kenya on mental illness, where the recognition and treatment of mental illness is almost non-existent.

### About our speaker:

Andrew White is a Winchester family physician who has a large population of depressed patients as well as having struggled with severe depression himself. He regularly teaches on mental illness, especially to those who are under-served. He is active in the healing prayer ministry at his church. Dr. White is both a medical doctor and has his Master of Arts in Theological Studies.
