The world we live in today, when push comes to shove, is really no different from the world our Lord was born into more than 2,000 years ago. Why?

Perhaps, we should consider not asking why but start asking who --- not who can answer these challenging questions but who can heal us, protect us, walk with us, redeem us, forgive us and grant unto us eternal and everlasting life --maybe, just maybe we should be seeking who can help us make sense of our lives, who can give meaning and purpose for our lives, who can calm the storms of our lives, who can make us whole and bring peace into our lives. 

### Top 12 tips for a happy, healthy Christmas

Here are the top 12 tips to help you enjoy Christmas AND set yourself up for a great 2019.

- 1. **RELAX, BUT DON'T LET YOUR GUARD DOWN.** "What the heck, it's Christmas!" It's a tempting excuse but one that won't lead you anywhere healthy! Resist the temptation to throw caution to the wind at Christmas there are too many opportunities to overeat and pile on those pounds that so many people never lose the following year.
- **2. KEEP ACTIVE.** Even just a daily walk will help to prevent your already over-burdened digestive system from becoming sluggish. Not only will walking help you work off the extra calories, but it's great for your mood.


# From a branch on the Vine,

Hear the satin voice of Karen Carpenter, "We've only just begun to live." And hear the words of Saint Paul, *Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: the old has gone, the new is here! 2 Corinthians 5:17.* New again. CCAP is located at 112 and 106 S. Kent Street.

November was an awesome time for CCAP collections at Burnt Factory UMC!!! - We were able to supply enough food for 17 complete Thanksgiving dinners for CCAP. We also donated an additional 10 turkeys. The food was distributed to CCAP clients the Saturday before Thanksgiving so they could prepare a meal for their families.

- We collected 28 blankets, 1416 diapers, and 956 wipes for CCAP from our Thanksgiving Eve service collection. These donations will be gratefully received by the clients at CCAP. ### FROM OUR FINANCE CHAIRPERSON

As we head into the close of 2018, let us take a moment to reflect upon a couple of blessings brought forth to our church.

- The beginning of the year presented the opportunity to acquire the property across the street that includes 15 acres of land. For the sum of \$395,000, we purchased 1934 Jordan Springs Road in April. Through a grant from the Winchester District, and generous donations, our loan balance is \$148,000.
- In August 2018 our electronic giving system hit a financial milestone. Our cumulative giving since the system launched in 2014, exceeded \$100,000. Since August, that number has grown to \$110,000. Electronic giving offers the convenience of automation and allows the opportunity to give while away on vacation or if watching via our live stream services.

Your practice of extravagant generosity of time and resources allows for many vital missions in our church and community. In January there will be some important documents provided to you. We will provide you with statements of giving for weekly offerings and a statement of contributions made on our estimated giving initiatives (EGI). If you are using the electronic tithe system, your ongoing emails serve as your receipt.

If you are looking for tax planning opportunities, we offer the ability to receive required minimum distribution payments from retirement plans or conversion of appreciated stock. Such strategies may help you lower taxable income or avoid capital gains tax.
