In 2018, Burnt Factory UMC donated more than \$6200 of items to CCAP; provided a Christmas meal to 29 families; stocked backpack meals weekly for 15 children at Fremont Street Nursery; worked the kettles for over 24 hours for the Salvation Army as well as the Youth shopped for 10 Christmas stockings.

Please forgive all the numbers, but these are needs that our church commits to meet through its people – YOU! Quarterly, we collect for the Laurel Center (over \$2000); we shelter the homeless for a week in December through WATTS; at Thanksgiving we collect diapers and blankets and provide meals for families. Our members tutor elementary children; we support Project Esperanza in the Dominican Republic.



Burnt Factory is not unique in its outreach; many churches and organizations are doing the good and right work that God asks of His followers. This partial list of activities is offered in humility as an invitation for you to serve in the Kingdom of God. There will always be a need as there will always be a God to meet that need. The beauty is God works **through** His people; He calls us to come alongside Him and join in His compassion and mercy. God asks you to be the representative of His Love.

Our Relay for Life team continues to lead the fight against cancer with over \$300,000 in fundraising. Every three months, the Faithseekers Sunday School class helps serve lunch at Jubilee Kitchen. Once a month, members of our church voluntarily serve lunch to the homeless. We have a food pantry and host Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts; and, as a church, we set aside a substantial part of our budget to help those who are struggling in the community and within our congregation.

Again, this is not to brag or to think we are blessed based on the works we do. No, this is to remind all of us, an opportunity is waiting to reach out and care for others. CCAP, Laurel Center, Red Wagon, Salvation Army, Project Esperanza, Valley Light, United Methodist Men, United Methodist Women, WATTS, Food Pantry, Tutoring, Relay for Life – and so much more. These are ways you can help not just by your donations, but also by your time, by your prayers – by your involvement. The path for mission goes through someone who God empowers as a vehicle of mercy in a hurting world.

Where will you shine? The choice to serve is not a burden. It is a blessing. You have the choice to change someone's circumstance towards what God intends for His people. Someone gets to eat; a child gets a gift; a mother beats cancer; a baby gets clothes; a boy gets to go to school. You have the choice to make it so. By the power and grace of Almighty God, you have the choice to make it so.

Outreach Summary for 2018

As we come to the end of 2018, it is truly a blessing to see the many ways that Burnt Factory has been present in the community and beyond. Here is a list of some of the areas that our congregation has been the hands and feet of Christ:

- BF food pantry over 20 deliveries to those in need
- Pickup food at Highland Food Pantry and deliver monthly to Budget Motel
- Assisting Fremont Street Nursery with 15 weekend bags of food each week
- WATTS housed and fed 35 homeless men and women for 7 nights
- \$1500 Annual Contribution to WATTS
- Greenwood Mill Elementary School Starfish Mentoring program and Bright Futures tutoring program
- Bell ringing for Salvation Army several weekends in December
- 29 Christmas meals for social services
- Collections for Laurel Center over \$2000 in value of various items were collected in February, May, August and October
- CCAP
 - -39 Easter baskets for children
 - -2580 diapers collected at Maundy Thursday Service
 - -Lunches served at CCAP the third Sunday of each month to an avg. of 40 guests.
 - -17 complete Thanksgiving dinners plus an additional 10 turkeys
 - -Various clothing items collected in January and July
 - -28 blankets, 1416 diapers and 956 wipes were collected at the Thanksgiving Eve service
 - -\$2000 Annual Contribution to CCAP
- Food and Christmas support of a family with 3 children
- \$1500 Annual Contribution to Project Esperanza in the Dominican Republic
- Relay for Life Annual participation
- UMMen, UMWomen, Adult Sunday School Classes, Children and Youth all continue to reach out into the community with various mission projects and collections

As we enter 2019, we are planning to offer a mission trip as offered through the District to aid with Hurricane Relief.

8 Easy New Year's Resolutions

Is getting healthier one of your New Year's resolutions?

Choose simple, realistic goals you can stick to,
Here are eight to try:

- 1. Eat more produce. Make small changes like taking a piece of fruit with you to work or adding spinach to your eggs.
- 2. Pack lunch more often. Avoid the extra sodium and calories (not to mention the expense) at restaurants by making your own lunch.
- 3. Drink more water. Buy a reusable water bottle and refill it throughout the day.
- 4. Eat real food. Eat real, whole foods made in a kitchen, not a laboratory.
- 5. Eat breakfast regularly. Fruit, a cup of yogurt or whole-wheat toast can get your metabolism going in the morning.
- 6. Listen to your belly. Eat regular healthy snacks like nuts and fruit to avoid getting so hungry that you overeat later.
- 7. Skip sugary drinks. Skip the empty calories and sugar crashes by drinking water or unsweetened tea instead.
- 8. Sit down to eat. Pause to savor your meals. You'll feel more satisfied, and be less likely to overeat.




