# From Our Pastor

The General Conference is the top policy-making body of The United Methodist Church. It is the voice and law of our denomination. It is global in structure and its membership is equally divided between clergy and laity. The General Conference convenes every four years and an updated Book of Discipline is published every four years. The General Conference 2020 will take place May 5-15, 2020, at the Minneapolis Convention Center in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The Council of Bishops has called a "Special Session" of the General Conference of The United Methodist Church to be held February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, Missouri. The purpose will be to act on a report from the Council of Bishops based on the recommendations of the **Commission on a Way Forward**. The 32-member Commission was appointed to examine paragraphs in *The Book of Discipline* concerning human sexuality and exploring options to strengthen the unity of the church. They were tasked with two challenges. (1.) Will the UMC make it possible for same -sex marriages to be performed by our pastors and accepted in our church and (2.) Will self-avowed, practicing homosexuals be able to become ordained in the UMC.

I, as your pastor, have held a lecture on this topic, offered a sermon series on this topic, have held an educational night on this topic and have met with groups within the church and with individuals. I am always available to speak with any of you on this topic and to educate you as to the particulars of the plans that will be submitted at the called conference

If you want more information --- you can simply go to the VAUMC website and click on Resources and then go to the 2019 General Conference page. You will then be able to navigate through a host of educational sources. You will be able to read for yourselves the three plans that will be submitted. Also, I have included in this newsletter, the contact information for our Virginia Annual Conference delegates. You can let them know how you feel if you so choose.

I ask that each one of you be in unceasing prayer for these delegates and that they will hear the clear voice of God in their discernment during this pivotal point in the history of the United Methodist Church.

I pray that after the decisions are made that we, as the body of Christ called Burnt Factory UMC, will be able to let the dust clear, process the information, pray, and then move forward as God would lead us; what-ever, where-ever, and how-ever that may be.

### February is American Heart Month

be kind to your heart and love on one another.

### Who should think twice about shoveling snow?

<u>Snow shoveling can be dangerous</u> - in **healthy** men, snow shoveling increases heart rate to 179, systolic blood pressure to 181, energy expenditure is about 9 METS which is higher than maximal stress test exertion for many people. If you lift the shovel 12 times per minute at 16 pounds per shovel that equals 16 pounds in 10 minutes!!!

#### THOSE MOST AT RISK FOR A HEART ATTACK INCLUDE:

- Anyone who has already had a heart attack
- Individuals with a history of heart disease
- Those with high blood pressure or high cholesterol levels
- Individuals leading a sedentary lifestyle

At least 75,000 heart attacks occur each year during or shortly following strenuous physical exertion. About 1 in every 3 of those are deadly.

When you shovel snow, you tend to hold your breath as you lift. That increases pressure in your chest and reduces blood flow to your heart. At the same time, cold air constricts your blood vessels. All of this pushes up you blood pressure and forces the heart to work even harder. If your heart arteries are damaged or partially blocked with plaque, these things can combine to set you up for a heart attack.

What about snow blowers? Using a snow blower can elevate your heart rate to 120 beats per minute and if you have a heart condition, that could still be a problem.

Bottom line - if you have heart disease and you don't have to shovel snow, then don't!!

CCAP, the Congregational-Community Action Project, is a cooperative ministry of 45 area churches and one synagogue serving Winchester and Frederick County that have joined together to provide financial, material and supportive assistance to people in need. CCAP is located at 112 and 106 S. Kent Street.

Thank you for generous support for our **January CCAP Day**. We collected 28 pieces of men's long underwear, 4 sweat suits, 116 pairs of socks, 51 pair of underwear, 19 t-shirts, and 4 pair of gloves!!! All of these items were New!! We also collected 2 heavy, warm coats and several additional pieces of clothing, pantry items and many small toiletry items that will be perfect for shower day. All of these items are in such demand at CCAP. "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matt.25:40).

Our next collection will be for **Easter Baskets**. CCAP expects to give away over 400 baskets. More information about our collection will be in next Month's newsletter and in the bulletin as the collection day nears.

On Sunday, January 20, at our **monthly CCAP lunch**; Karen and Randy Willis and their team served over 25 clients. It was a really cold day, but a warm meal of soup and ham sandwiches along with desserts, fruit and take away snacks was served. There was also plenty of warmth generated when they "Shared the love of Christ with all People." Our next Sunday Lunch will be served on February 17 starting at 12:15 at CCAP. Donna Gallagher will be the team lead for this meal. We would love to have more volunteers for preparing food and serving. #### Notes from the January quarterly CCAP Mtg:

- 564 families received turkeys and all the fixings for Thanksgiving. At Christmas, 371 families received turkeys. The blankets our church collected at our Thanksgiving Eve Service provided new blankets for many families during the Christmas giveaway.
- The Slate of Officers for 2019 were voted in: President Frances Salmon, Vice President Robin Russell, Secretary Mary Hall, Treasurer Linda Bishop and At Large Members Joe Lewis, Judy Bogner and Bob Brock.
- CCAP Hours added on Monday evenings. The main building is now open Monday evenings from 5-7:30 for those who work and cannot come in during the day. The goal is to also open the Pantry during the Monday hours. Once all volunteers are in place, the public will be notified.
- Clothing volunteers are needed to sort!! Our very own Robin Russell was elected Vice-President of CCAP and will now be coordinating the Clothing area. We are also looking for volunteers to come in on a Saturday to help sort clothing. In December alone, 1,538 clients were served in the clothing areas.
- In the last quarter of 2018, 12,132 clients were served in the pantry area. Many volunteers are needed to serve this many people.
- The Baby/Toddler Room is still looking for volunteers on Thursday and Friday mornings from 8:30-noon. If volunteers are not found, this room will not be open on those days.

Everyone is part of the body of Christ, and that's true for people with a developmental disability, too! Heart Havens is all about helping the people that this ministry supports to be parts of the Body across the Virginia Conference, both at church and in their communities.

February is the month set aside by the Virginia Conference for Heart Havens to tell their story of joy and empowerment. At Heart Havens, they know that home is more than just a house.
