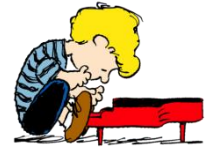
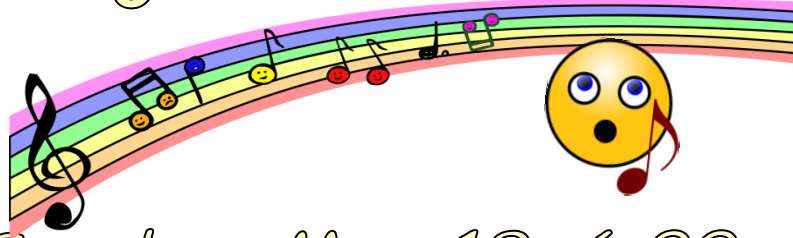

May Faith Community Nurse Article

May 12th - 18th is National Women's Health Week



Women have health needs that change throughout their lifetime. Check out the following to see what screenings or exam you may need as a healthy adult. Please keep in mind that this is not a comprehensive list and it is important to speak to your healthcare provider. Be sure to share your medical and family history, personal preferences, and lifestyle with your provider to help them develop a preventative health plan that is tailored to you.

The Routine Check-up FOR WOMEN

Health screenings provide a lifestyle check-up and the opportunity for physicians to detect conditions or disease in early stages.

From ages 20 - 49, women should visit their primary care provider every 1 - 3 years for a complete check-up.

A complete check-up includes...

Physical exam

Skin exam

Clinical Breast exam

Cervical Cancer exam

Blood Pressure check

Body Mass Index check

Immunization Status check

Lab Testing*

*as appropriate for history or age

Clinical Breast Exam

From 20 - 44, women can receive a clinical breast exam **every 3 years**.

Yearly screenings are recommended starting at age 45. Between visits, women should perform monthly self-breast exams and alert their physician to any changes.

Mammograms are recommended at physician's discretion starting at age 40.

Once You Turn 50...

Your screenings should be **Yearly**. In addition to the procedures listed above, these annual physicals will now include annual mammograms and colorectal screenings.

Pneumonia vaccinations may start at age 65 according to guidelines.

Osteoporosis

Women can be evaluated for risk of osteoporosis at any age. A bone density screening (Dexascan) is recommended at **AGE 65** for women with no risk factors. For women with abnormal results, screening is recommended every two years.

CCAP, the Congregational-Community Action Project, is a cooperative ministry of area churches and one synagogue serving Winchester and Frederick County that have joined together to provide financial, material and supportive assistance to people in need. CCAP is located at 112 and 106 S. Kent Street.

A BIG THANK YOU to our congregation for all you did for CCAP in April:

- We provided 49!! Easter Baskets for the giveaway. These baskets were prepared by many loving hands and were beautiful.
- At our Maundy Thursday Service, we collected 2552 diapers for the Red Wagon Ministry!!! This is a tremendous number of diapers and will serve at least 85 babies and toddlers. Thanks so much to everyone who donated, helped load and deliver the diapers. This Ministry at CCAP, led by Jody Stephenson, was very grateful for our donation.

Current Needs at CCAP:

We are in need of tents (3-4 Man size is best) and tarps for our homeless clients.

- **The Food Pantry Needs:** White rice, cereal, dried beans, spaghetti sauce, canned meat and egg noodles. We also need Umbrellas (the small ones from the dollar store work well). Also laundry detergent, deodorant, razors for men and women, sunscreen, Chap Stick and bug spray.
- **The Clothing House** can always use men's jeans and belts.
- **Volunteers** are needed in the clothing and pantry areas. There is also a need for volunteers at the Red Wagon Ministry, which is located in the clothing house. A couple of hours a week goes a long way.

Lunch at CCAP on the 3rd Sunday of each month. Thanks so much to everyone who came out Easter Sunday and hosted a wonderful meal for CCAP clients. We served fried chicken and lots of side dishes and fruit. We served about 65 clients and we had a beautiful time of fellowship. Thanks to the hands that made and the hands that served this meal. Our next Sunday Lunch will be served on May 19 starting at 12:15 at CCAP. I am the team lead for this meal. We would love to have more volunteers for preparing food and serving. From a branch on the Vine

⁹ For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁰ He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him. ¹¹ Therefore **encourage one another and build each other up**, just as in fact you are doing. (1 Thessalonians 5:9-11)

Standing in the garden section of Lowe's, I was trying to determine what would help my azaleas and rhododendrons be healthy. What food would build them up? I decided on "shake it out" granules from Miracle-Gro. Getting home, I did the radical exercise of reading the instructions.

¹⁶ All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that the servant of God may be thoroughly **equipped for every good work**. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

I was ready to apply – deciding on the product and the "how-to." I was also taking into account the many times I had seen fertilizer applied. You don't dump it on or it kills everything like poison, but shake out too little is a waste of time. Watching and listening to others gave me a better understanding on how to feed my plants.

Therefore, since we are **surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses**, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, ² fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith....(Hebrews 12:1-2)

Why would I do all this to begin with? My goal was to grow a better plant, and from my own experience, I know the right fertilizer, applied the right way would produce results.

¹⁰ **Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.**

¹¹ **Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me.**

¹² **Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.**

¹³ **Then I will teach transgressors your ways, so that sinners will turn back to you.**

(Psalm 51:10-130)

Receiving the Word of God, witnessing God at work in the lives of others, and drawing on our own story, you and I have a personal testimony of the way that leads to eternal life. Not just existence, but the more abundant life. People want that! It is found in our lives as Disciples of Jesus. God's Word instructs us. God's people teach us. 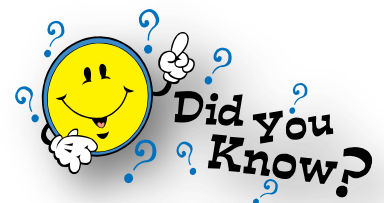
