My granddaughter, Abby, will turn 12 this November and is many years away from dating (at least 10 years, maybe 15!!!!) But when she does begin to date, God's word can be such an important guide! I ran across this article not long ago and placed it in my save file. When the time comes, I will give it to Abby. Maybe it will serve as a tool to help with your daughter or son when that time comes.

This was written by a mother named Diane Stark. "When my daughter had a crush on a boy, I asked her to place his name into 1st Corinthians 13: 4-6. I said to replace the word love with the name of your crush and that may help you to decide on whether to date this young lad or not. The boys name was Sean. So, she did --- "Sean is patient and kind; Sean does not envy or boast; Sean is not arrogant or rude. Sean does not insist in his own way; Sean is not irritable or resentful. Sean does not rejoice at wrongdoing but rejoices with the *truth.*" Her daughter frowned and said, "I saw him pick on another boy in the hallway. He was not very kind." I guess I need to rethink my interest in Sean.

This practice, the author went on to say, did not only give my daughter greater discernment about others, but even more importantly, it helped her to reflect on her own behavior. I asked my daughter to substitute her own name into that passage!

Friends, perhaps all of us need to place our names in that passage occasionally, to check ourselves and the way we treat and interact with others. It couldn't hurt.

"Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; love is not arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way; love is not irritable or resentful; love does not rejoice at wrongdoing but rejoices with *the truth!"* 1st Corinthians 13: 4-6

From a branch on the Vine,

I promise to write something worth reading (a change I know). Now, what do you expect? Pulitzer-caliber magic that will inspire and awe you? My promise is to intentionally do my best . And, if I do not write something worth reading, what is the consequence? Is a promise worth keeping? What is the value of a vow, or the worth of giving your word?

In the recent small-group study of Max Lucado's *Unshakable Hope*, we were reminded the hope we have in all circumstances is anchored to the promises of God. Does God keep His promises?

> ⁹ "Know therefore that the Lord your God is God; He is the faithful God, keeping His covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love Him and keep His commandments." **Deuteronomy 7:9**



What God promises \sim He fulfills. To do otherwise is inconsistent with His nature. He promised to break the chains of sin so you can live forgiven. How do we do on keeping our vows?

I promised myself to my wife 36 years ago. I put my character on the line when the vows left my lips. In honesty, I haven't done my best. There are times I have not been present in the relationship. I haven't been open to her needs, and I have short-changed her on investing in our marriage. I am very blessed she is forgiving and has continued to offer me training. I have also made promises to my family and friends, some with the best intentions, some as a matter of convenience. I should be better.

Again, what is the consequence of not fulfilling my promises? A shaking of the head, a stern look, a terse tongue-lashing? Maybe the loss of a relationship? The true cost is the loss of my integrity. Am I to be believed when I make promises? Coming close is not the same as fulfilling what I commit to.

In my baptism, I promised/ I vowed/ I gave an oath that I would make Jesus Christ the Lord of my life. He would be my guide in all aspects of my life, and I would honor Him, praise Him and proclaim Him. Are the vows I made to God important?

⁴ "When you make a vow to God, do not delay to fulfill it. He has no pleasure in fools; fulfill your vow.
⁵ It is better not to make a vow than to make one and not fulfill it." Ecclesiastes 5:4-5

I would say, "YES!" Remember the old adage, "Say what you mean and mean what you say?" There is truth in those words. In His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said:

³³ "Again, you have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not break your oath, but fulfill to the Lord the vows you have made.' ³⁴ But I tell you, do not swear an oath at all: either by heaven, for it is God's throne; ³⁵ or by the earth, for it is his footstool; or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the Great King. ³⁶ And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make even one hair white or black. ³⁷ All you need to say is simply 'Yes' or 'No;' anything beyond this comes from the evil one." Matthew 5:33-37

Jesus' stepbrother writes:

¹² "Above all, my brothers and sisters, do not swear—not by heaven or by earth or by anything else. All you need to say is a simple "Yes" or "No." Otherwise you will be condemned." James 5:12

If you can't (or won't) live up to your vows, don't make them. Otherwise, do what you say you will do. Let your yes be your yes and your no, be your no. The difficulty will be great at times, but you will have an honest soul that people will respect and God will find fertile for growing His Kingdom. Be True.





WHAT TO DO IF YOU THINK SOMEONE MAY BE HAVING A STROKE:

- Act quickly because TIME IS BRAIN.
- If the person is already a patient in the hospital, notify the patient's nurse right away. A "Code Stroke" is activated by calling the emergency operator at 25800 and the stroke team will be alerted.
- For a non-hospitalized person with stroke symptoms, such as a visitor or co-worker, have a nearby person assist you to monitor the person and activate the Medical Emergency Response Team (MERT) by dialing 25800.
