## *From Our Pastor*

As your pastor, I sometimes take for granted that everyone knows about our Methodist history and Wesleyan heritage. It is a rich and wonderful history. In the Jan. edition of our United Methodist monthly, the "Advocate," there is a short and concise history about our founder, John Wesley (1703-1791). I thought you may like to read about this enthusiastic and devoted man of God.

John Wesley was born June 28, 1703, died March 2, 1791, and was the principle founder of the Methodist movement. His mother was important in his emotional and educational development. John's education continued at Charterhouse School and at Oxford, where he studied at Christ Church and was elected (1726) fellow at Lincoln College. He was ordained in 1728.

After a brief absence (1727-29) to help his father at Epworth, John returned to Oxford to discover that his brother, Charles, had founded a Holy Club composed of young men interested in spiritual growth. John quickly became a leading participant of this group, which was dubbed the Methodists. His Oxford days introduced him not only to the rich tradition of classical literature and philosophy but also spiritual classics like Thomas A. Kempis' "Imitation of Christ," Jeremy Taylor's "Holy Living and Dying," and William Law's "Serious Call."

In 1735, both Wesleys accompanied James Oglethorpe to the new colony in Georgia, where John's attempts to apply his then high church views aroused hostility. Discouraged, he returned (1737) to England; he was rescued from discouragement by the influence of the Moravian preacher Peter Boehler. At a small religious meeting in Aldersgate Street, London, on May 24, 1738, John Wesley had an experience in which his "heart was strangely warmed." After this spiritual conversion, which centered on the realization of salvation by faith in Christ alone, he devoted his life to evangelism. Beginning in 1739, he established Methodist societies throughout the country. He traveled and preached constantly, especially in the London-Bristol-Newcastle triangle, with frequent forays into Wales, Ireland and Scotland. He encountered much opposition and persecution, which later subsided.

Late in life John Wesley married Mary Vazeille, a widow. He continued throughout his life a regimen of personal discipline and ordered living. He died at 88, still preaching, still traveling, and still a clergyman of the Church of England. In 1784, however, he had given the Methodist Societies a legal constitution, and in the same year he ordained Thomas Coke for ministry in the United States; this action signaled an independent course for Methodism.

John Wesley said: *"Do all the good you can, in all the ways you can, to all the souls you can, in every place you can, at all the times you can, with all the zeal you can, as long as ever you can. Catch on fire with enthusiasm and people will come from miles to watch you burn."*

As we endure this cold winter together, let us all warm ourselves with the fire of enthusiasm; a fire that is lit by the love of Jesus Christ. As we minister together, let us burn with desire to please our Lord and seek the lost! Let us be set ablaze with encouragement, devotion, and faithfulness as we endeavor to make disciples of Christ for the transformation of the world! God bless you all!

#### **Notes from the January CCAP Board Meeting:**

**Thanksgiving:** 591 families were served. Frances said the Churches did a bang-up job of supplying meals.

**Christmas:** 256 families were served. Frances felt the first try at not duplicating services in Winchester and Frederick Co. was fairly successful.

**Pantry:** 3236 people were served in November, 3441 in December. Becoming USDA certified has been a success and saved money for CCAP.

**Clothing:** is still in need of daily sorters in the main building. Hours are 8:30 – 2:30 M-TH; 8:30 – 11:30 on Friday. The Clothing House needs volunteers M-F from 8:30 to noon. Clothing served 1354 people in November, and 1330 people in December.

**The Baby/Toddler Room (Red Wagon)** gave out 82,940 diapers in 2019. They are also in need of volunteers and diapers size 4 and 5 and socks; as well as underwear for ages 2-4 and children's books.

The house is completely staffed for the first time in a while and Danny, Steven, Charles and Joey have adjusted very well to the changes albeit minor changes. Things have gone extremely well during the transition.



The Winchester District United Methodist Men will sponsor the Jim Green Memorial Bowl-A-Thon on February 29<sup>th</sup> from Noon to 3:00 PM at Northside Lanes. 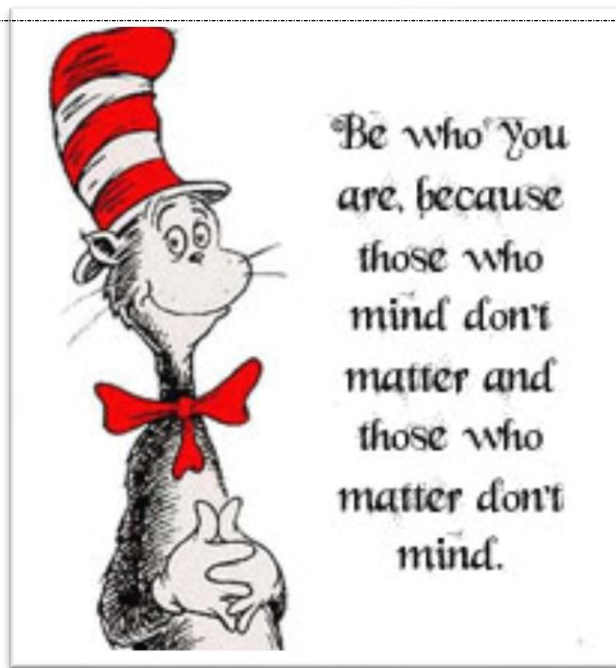

### February is Cancer Prevention Month. Here's what you can do:

**QUIT SMOKING.** *Avoiding tobacco use is the single most important step we can take to reduce cancer in this country. **Smoking = 30 % of all U.S. cancer deaths.***

**EXERCISE.** *Get 2.5 hours of moderate aerobic activity or 1.25 hours of vigorous activity per week. **A sedentary lifestyle = 25-30% of several of the major cancers.***

**EAT RIGHT.** *To lower your risk of getting cancers of the mouth, pharynx, larynx, esophagus, stomach, lung and potentially colon, pancreas and prostate. **Daily eat 1 – 2 ½ cups of fruit and 1 – 4 cups of vegetables.***

**WEAR SUNSCREEN.** *Melanoma cases have increased to an estimate of more than 76,000 new cases each year. **Protect yourself from the sun.***
