Since there is no better letter writer in history than the Apostle Paul, I chose to begin this correspondence with his opening remarks from his letter sent to the churches of the Galatian region.

"Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, who gave himself for our sins to rescue us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, to whom be glory for ever and ever."

I am writing in response to the breaking news this weekend about a proposed split that will be brought before the 2020 General Conference this May. The proposal seeks to alleviate the continuing pain, disunity and anxiety that has permeated our denomination over the last 40 years regarding same gender marriage and ordination requirements for practicing LGBTQ persons.

The proposal was arrived at by a group of 16 respected leaders in our denomination under the leadership of an impartial mediator. These 16 members represented all spectrums of the conflict. The proposal, in its most simplest form, seeks to recognize that the division within our global United Methodist Church is unrepairable and that we can no longer "agree to disagree" and that the only solution is to split and to create an additional denomination that will continue to abide by the current Discipline of the church.

The proposal seeks to conclude the continuing controversy that has decimated our productivity and witness as participants and partners in the building of God's Kingdom on earth. Our universal mission and ministry has suffered and most of all our testimony to the world has been muted, misquoted, and mis-represented.

<u>What I want to make clear is that regardless of what you read in the press; this is a proposal only!</u> Until the General Conference which meets in May votes, nothing has been decided. There will be many proposals at General Conference, and it has been my experience that anything can happen. Having said that, I do believe that this proposal has a more than good chance of passing and if it does, then Burnt Factory UMC will enter into the due diligence required to explore and make the decisions we need to make. Until then, it is my hope and prayer that we will continue to keep witnessing to the love of Christ and keep serving Him sacrificially as we have always done!

In 2019, Burnt Factory UMC experienced the most successful year to date. Our mission output and ministry opportunities were at an all-time high! Our giving was extravagant, gracious and very generous! Our attendance was also an all-time high coming in at an average of 285 a Sunday! Lives have been transformed and we have made a difference in our community!

We have much to be thankful for and I am humbled by this faith community's continuing obedience to the Holy Spirit! We have overcome the schism in our denomination and have, indeed, agreed to disagree. While many churches have imploded, closed, or been decimated by these issues, we have thrived!

Whatever the decision of the General Conference is, I am confident that BFUMC will remain unified in seeking to make a difference in this world for the glory of Jesus Christ! I am convinced that BFUMC will continue to share the love of Jesus Christ with everyone. I am persuaded that whatever may come, we will stand together, not for our praise, but to praise the one who came to set us free, the Prince of Peace, our Savior, Jesus Christ! To Him be all glory, honor and praise!

In closing, I plead with you; let the next 5 months be filled with prayer, prayer and more prayer! Let there be, in the midst of this challenge and struggle, the light of Christ come shining through! Whatever may happen and whatever decisions may come; know this:

"You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." 1st Peter 2: 9-10

May the love of God, the grace of our Lord Jesus and the Communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all!

I do NOT like CANCER anywhere!!!



The United States Congress designated January as **Cervical Health Awareness Month.** More than 13,000 women in the United States are diagnosed with invasive **cervical cancer** each year, but the disease is preventable with **HPV vaccination** and **Pap Smear screening**. The CDC recommends all boys and girls get the **HPV vaccine** at age 11 or 12 as the vaccine produces a stronger immune response when taken during the preteen years. For this reason, up until age 14, only two doses of the vaccine are required. The vaccine is available for all males and females through age 45. The U. S. Preventive Services Task Force recommends screening for **cervical cancer** in women age 21 to 65 years with a **Pap smear** every 3 years.

As of January 7, 2020 our team has raised \$3,234.00!!!!!
