That is okay, but I recommend that we all consider, perhaps a deeper, more poignant sacrifice. As we all reflect on our sin and on whether our devotion and commitment to Jesus is where it should be, perhaps we should consider giving up:

Fear of failure -- Feelings of Unworthiness -- Impatience -- Judgment -- People Pleasing --

Comparison -- Blame -- Guilt -- Impurity -- Entitlement -- Apathy -- Negativity -- Bitterness?

You know friends, we are to give up something, we are to fast, so that God can fill the empty spaces in our soul and spirit! I pray that we all take time in this special season of the church year to experience a true Lenten season and may God fill you with hope, faith, charity, generosity, clarity, peace, assurance, compassion, confidence, purpose, gratitude, humility and love!!!

Families and Lent

Lent is the holy time we celebrate that begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26th and leads up to Easter Sunday. It lasts for 40 days (not including Sundays) representing the 40 days that Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness. It is time to think about the life we can give to others and the ways we can share Jesus' love with each other and with other people. When we give the gift of ourselves through caring, we are like Jesus because He gave Himself to us. Lent can be a time when we strengthen our families through caring and giving. Some suggestions for giving and caring that you may want to include this Lenten season include:

- Greet family members with a hug when they come home from work or school
- Help another person with his/her work
- Have a family night with children planning the menu and the activity
- Have each parent spend some time alone with each child
- Make cleaning a family project
- Play a game with a family member
- Visit someone who is lonely or sick
- Write a letter to an elderly person in your congregation

With every family member's help, Lent can be a time when your family grows closer, more loving and more caring.

As you may have heard, Burnt Factory is starting a new ministry for caregivers. I have been a caregiver myself. My husband Rick and I cared for Mom 18 years, with 15 of those years with dementia/Alzheimer's. So, I know all the feelings you are experiencing. You probably struggle with anger/frustration, anxiety/fear, depression/sadness, guilt and grief.

We will have our first gathering on Tues. March 10th @ 7:00 pm, in the Faithseekers Room. I look forward to our time of sharing and caring. Hearts of Grace provides an opportunity for people to share personal experiences and feelings, gather helpful information and be in a nurturing fellowship with other caregivers, just like you.

Caregivers are all around. Your neighbors, your co-workers, and your friends. You!! Caregivers may be parents of a child with disability or special needs, adults with mentally ill or disabled friends, or adults with aging, sick, or dying parents. Still others provide care as part of their job. Caregiving will affect most of our lives in some way, whether we find ourselves on the giving or receiving end.

As Christians living like Jesus, who loves so graciously and generously, we have a clear call to love and care for others. That kind of life glorifies our heavenly Father and reflects the love of the ultimate Caregiver, Jesus Christ. He promises to guide us, supplying us with the strength, wisdom, compassion, stamina, and joy we need for our journey as a caregiver.

(Jesus said,) If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you. John 13:14-15

The circumstances and demands of caregivers are varied. While each situation is unique, as a caregiver, you could likely describe your life as:

very blessed, but craving time to rest; some days thriving but, at times, just surviving; emotionally spent, though often content; sometimes struggling with guilt to the hilt; learning on the go, wanting to be in the know; desperate for respite when embattled and rattled; always trying, often sighing, and sometimes crying; defeating the blues with your Savior's Good News; embracing God's forgiveness and grace every day, every place.

Unless you work as a paid, trained caregiver, your call was likely unplanned and a major interruption that changed most aspects of your life. Some respond to this call like Moses, Jeremiah, or Jonah, all of whom resisted God's will. Others echo the psalmists, who cried out to God with defeated, overwhelmed, or fearful hearts. Some respond like Isaiah, reluctant at first, but then declaring, "Here I am! Send me." (Isaiah 6:8). And others may realize, like Esther, that they are exactly where they need to be (Esther 4:14). In all those examples, God supplied untrained, unsuspecting men and women with the strength, grace, and ability to serve. He'll do the same for you.

Thank you for living God's call to care, serve, and love just as Christ loves, serves, and cares for you. Throughout your journey, trust the Holy Spirit to provide real-life encouragement from God's word, his people, and from this group.

Children's Ministries Bible Literacy Program



We are going to "*MARCH*" forward into Bible Literacy in 2020. We are starting a Kidz Bible Club in which the children, who desire to participate, will be assigned a scripture to memorize. The children will recite that scripture to me on Sundays, or other evening services or special events, and they will earn Bible Bucks. Packets will come home with them on the first Sunday in March that will give guidelines and helps for parents to work with the children on memorizing their scriptures. On the second Sunday of each month during the Sunday School hour we will have <u>in class</u> Kidz Bible Club programs. The children will be involved in activities that will help them memorize and go deeper with their scriptures. From a branch on the Vine,

I found a story in the Bible I can relate to, but perhaps not as you might think. In the book of Numbers, chapter 22, we read of Balaam, a prophet for hire, and his loyal companion, a donkey. This is the story of a talking donkey. The talking donkey is not why I relate to the story (you may think differently).

Moses is leading the Israelites out of Egypt, and they are victorious against the local inhabitants on the way to the Promised Land. They come to the land of Moab and the king there tries to hire Balaam to curse the Israelites. Balaam refuses saying he can do nothing that is not God's will. Eventually God directs him to go; so, he saddles up his donkey. On the way, an angel of the Lord



stood in Balaam's path. Only the donkey saw the angel and tried to avoid the confrontation, but Balaam beat the donkey to get him back on course. He did this three times, and, finally the Lord opened the Donkey's mouth, "What have I done to you to make you beat me these three times?" Unfazed, Balaam replies, "You have made a fool of me! If only I had a sword in my hand, I would kill you right now." The donkey said to Balaam, "Am I not your own donkey, which you have always ridden, to this day? Have I been in the habit of doing this to you?" "No," he said.

³¹ Then the Lord opened Balaam's eyes, and he saw the angel of the Lord standing in the road with his sword drawn. So, he bowed low and fell facedown.

Have you been rejected, even attacked, for trying to help someone? It may be a simple matter of sharing your experience, but the listener snubs your advice. If you are a parent, you have felt your guidance for your children go unheeded (as we did to our parents). Or, when you witness to the joy of Jesus, but it falls on deaf ears. Good intentions are not always met with acceptance. Its frustrating; you are trying to do good and people don't want it.

Help me remember why we do good. For attention? For the adoration of others? To make us feel good? Maybe we should start with ~ it is the right thing to do as asked by Our Father in Heaven. Is doing good its own reward? I can see that, but that's not all. Doing good is being a vessel for God to do good. God brings us into his plan to show love.

Balaam's donkey was trying to get his rider out of trouble, even though Balaam was blind to the trouble ahead. The donkey did good; still, Balaam beat him. Jesus warned his disciples: *"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." John 16:33*

We are going to have trouble, and we are going to be hated for being vessels for God to do good. That is the truth of the world we live in. Then, why not stop caring? Because the Kingdom of God is to do and be good as a reflection of He who is good. We continue to do good because He continues to do good. We forgive because He forgives. We are merciful because He is merciful. We love because He loves. Heartache (trouble) will come because the world does not know the God we know and who knows us.
