10 Scriptures of Encouragement for Caregivers



Caregiving is an immense burden to carry. You're expected to meet someone else's needs, all while keeping normal life afloat. You feel weary, lonely, hopeless, and frazzled. Perhaps you wonder if anyone notices you as more attention is given to the person under your care. When the road seems endless, God provides what we need for today. When we feel abandoned, His Word reminds us we're not alone. When we face hard decisions, He offers wisdom and peace. When we're at the end of our rope, He soothes us with comfort and fills us with strength. If you're facing one of the following scenarios in your caregiving journey, I pray you're encouraged by these Scriptures. You are not alone. You're seen and loved. If you're facing one of the following scenarios in your journey, I pray you're encouraged by these scriptures.

1. When There's No End in Sight

Give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread. – Proverbs 30:8b (NIV)

2. When You Feel Far from God

The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth. - Psalm 145:18 (NIV)

3. When You Have to Cause Pain

You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you. Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord, the Lord himself, is the Rock eternal. – Isaiah 26:3-4 (NIV)

4. When You Need Someone to Comfort You

I am worn out from sobbing. All night I flood my bed with weeping, drenching it with my tears. My vision is blurred by grief; my eyes are worn out because of all my enemies... The Lord has heard my plea; the Lord will answer my prayer. – Psalm 6:6-7, 9 (NLT)

5. When You Want a Moment to Yourself

6. When Your Care Recipient Doesn't Act Like Himself

Love bears all things [regardless of what comes], believes all things [looking for the best in each one], hopes all things [remaining steadfast during difficult times], and endures all things [without weakening]. – I Corinthians 13:4-7 (AMP)

7. When Your Care Recipient Is in Pain

Now may the Lord of peace Himself grant you His peace at all times and in every way [that peace and spiritual well-being that comes to those who walk with Him, regardless of life's circumstances]. The Lord be with you all. – II Thessalonians 3:16 (AMP)
