Heat Exhaustion/Sunstroke

The summer sun in moderation is healthy but can become dangerous if the body gets too warm. Excessive activity, exercise or time in the sun will increase if the body's temperature which makes you sweat in an effort to release that extra heat. Sometimes this response becomes overloaded, shuts down, and causes a potentially life-threatening condition known as heat stroke or sunstroke. Your symptoms can range from clammy skin, dry mouth, fatigue, dizziness and headaches to an absence of sweating, shallow breathing, confusion, loss of consciousness, and even death.

This rise in body heat can also occur if you participate in an excessive amount of exercise without replacing the body's fluid. A loss of fluid will occur at a faster rate if your activity is outside in the heat or during times of high humidity. Because of this rapid loss, you will not be aware of your dehydrated state and you will become overheated very quickly. To combat the risk of heat stress or stroke, when exercising or working in a hot environment you must drink 2 - 4 glasses of water (16 - 32oz) each hour to replace the fluids lost through sweating.

To prevent heat stress or the more serious condition of heat stroke, it is important to know risk factors and tips for prevention. High risk individuals are infants, toddlers, and the elderly as they are not able to control their body's heat as well as adults. People with disabilities, chronic diseases, certain medications, and working environments in extreme heat are more susceptible to heat illnesses. Be observant. Decrease the possibility of heat illness by dressing in cool clothing and drinking plenty of fluids without caffeine. Ask your doctor about side effects of your medications, stay in cool places when it is hot and humid, and find shade when working or playing in the heat. PROTECT THE SKIN YOU'RE IN by using a layered approach for **Sun Protection**.



Alzheimer's Wandering Series

Part 2: 8 Ways to prevent Alzheimer's/Dementia wandering - (#1 & 2 of 8)

1. Install door and window alarms and locks

Making it difficult for someone with Alzheimer's or dementia to get outside the house is essential to preventing wandering.

Simple home safety modifications can make it tough for them to open doors to the outside, including:

- Adding childproof door knob covers make it more difficult to open doors.
- Installing an addit2ional lock higher up on the door so they're out of your older adult's line of sight because people with dementia often don't look above eye level try this for regular doors. **Note**: We had two sets of sliding glass doors. So for my mother, in the event she was able to unlock, we put a long piece of wood, which fit in the track. This way even if she unlocked the door, it wouldn't slide open.
- Installing door and window alarms to alert you if they're opened.
- Using pressure-sensitive alarm mat next to their bed to alert you if they get up at night.
- Using an alarm like Safe Wander that can be triggered when a specific threshold is crossed.

Important: Be aware of fire safety needs for everyone in the house. Make sure all locks are easily accessible to people without cognitive impairment. Doors should still be able to be opened quickly in case of emergency.

2. Camouflage doors that lead outside

Another way to discourage your older adult from opening doors that lead outside is to camouflage them. Often, people with dementia won't be able to find the door if you cover it up or won't open it if you place large signs on it.

For example: you could install a curtain rod above the door to hang a dark curtain or wall hanging over the door. Slide the curtain open and close as needed, taking care to not let your older adult see you do it.

You could also place large signs saying "DO NOT ENTER" or "STOP" on the door. Many people with dementia won't open a door with those types of signs.

Another effective technique is to put a large black doormat in front of the door.

Seniors with dementia often think that dark areas of the floor are holes and won't walk over them. This will discourage them from actually reaching the door.

Next month we will continue the series "Ways to prevent Alzheimer's wandering."


