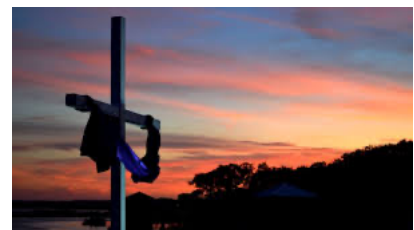
Easter

From Nancy Walsh, the Virginia UMW president: "After five years of research United Methodist Women launched a new name, and a new identity that seeks to engage newer, younger members and adapt to the changeable circumstances of today's world while maintaining connections despite the threat of impending split in The United Methodist Church." UMW transition officer Sally Vonner said that the corporate name of the organization will continue to be United Methodist Women "doing business as United Women in Faith."**

We enjoyed refreshments provided by Kathy Dixon, then recited our PURPOSE. Anne Perrault reported on our treasury status. We had an update on Project Esperanza.

The Prayer Breakfast, scheduled for March, was cancelled for an in-person gathering for 2022. The Executive Committee will have a zoom meeting Sunday, April 3 and visit the idea about the possibility of an outdoor gathering.

Our school kits will need to be taken to Duncan Memorial UM Church on June 4th between 11:00am – 3:00pm. The school kits will stay within the Winchester District. Volunteers are needed that day at Duncan.

Thanks to Doris Duvall and Marcia Etu, we were treated to detailed information about the Afghan family our church supports. Several from our church have been very involved in the preparations to make this family of eight comfortable in a home in Winchester. Marcia and Debbie Moss told us of the many details that needed to be worked out – and continue to need attention. We realized how God has worked to help make this whole process come together and work. Doris gave us cards to be used as a guide for praying for the Afghan Family and for the people in Ukraine. An offering was taken for the Call to Prayer program to be sent to the district treasurer.

A shamrock with a pen was given with a missionary name having a birthday in March and April. We will e-mail a birthday greeting to them and pray for their work in the mission field.

Our next meeting will be April 21. Debbie Moss will be our hostess and a program leader is needed. Hopefully, we will be back on schedule with our meetings every other month from now on.

Several of our regulars could not attend this March meeting and they were missed. Those of us who were there were so pleased to be informed of all the work that has gone on in preparation for the Afghan family's placement. Many of our members had contributed needed items for the home. Our meeting was closed with prayer by Pastor Steve.

Our prayer card from Doris quoted Dr. David Jeremiah: "Prayer may be the greatest tool that God has given us here on this earth to serve Him and others." Let's make the Afghan Family and the Ukraine people a big focus of our prayers each day.

The WATTS 2021-22 season ended on March 26th. Please remember our friends that we met in November and those who have come to the shelter since then in your prayers as they head back to their outdoor homes.

Just after our week of hosting WATTS increased their capacity to 45 guests and opened their warming center in Market Street UMC during the first week of December guaranteeing our guests the opportunity to be out of the cold for most of the day during the harsh winter weather.

WATTS has some things to work on this off-season as the City of Winchester decides on a city policy concerning homeless shelters. It looks like for now they are working on getting a permanent location for their Warming/Cooling center and will rotate the Winter shelter between the churches. In an informal survey among their guests, they really enjoy coming out to the different churches.

Please know how much the WATTS guests and their staff appreciate the efforts of all the volunteer churches and groups that make their mission possible. They are very busy during our week, but when I go back after our week is over, they always thank us for what we do for the guests.

Keep an eye out on the newsletter and if any changes or updates occur over the summer, I will let you know. There may be some fundraisers or public events as well for us to support WATTS.

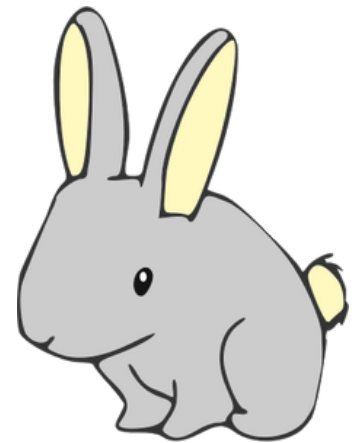

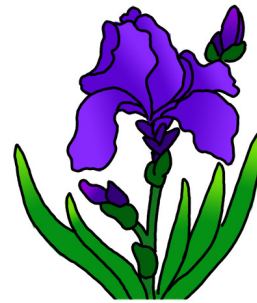

April 2022 Relay for Life Newsletter Article

April is Cancer Control Month, and I would like to share some thoughts with you on lung cancer. What are the symptoms of lung cancer? It can cause a variety of symptoms – cough, hoarseness, chest pain (continual ache), shortness of breath, coughing up blood, frequent bouts of pneumonia or bronchitis, weight loss, fatigue, and loss of appetite. What can you do to reduce your risk of lung cancer? First, the most important thing you can do is to not smoke. Smoking is the main cause of the large increase in cancer deaths. The good news is that people who stop smoking can reduce their risk of getting lung cancer in the future. Second, try to limit your exposure to certain workplace toxins (asbestos, arsenic, radiation). Third, try to avoid exposure to second-hand smoke.

CCAP Corner

APRIL 2022

CCAP, the Congregational-Community Action Project, is a cooperative ministry of area churches and one synagogue serving Winchester and Frederick County that have joined together to provide financial, material, and supportive assistance to people in need. CCAP is located at 112 and 106 S. Kent Street.

Easter Giveaway at CCAP:

The food we are currently collecting in our Bins will be given away at CCAP on Saturday, April 9. Large food boxes, hams, Easter baskets and fillers will be given away.

Food Box Packing Team – Our team is now scheduled to pack boxes on the first Tuesday of each month. We spend @ 2 hours packing food boxes for the Pantry. These boxes are key to feeding our CCAP families. We enjoy meeting together and working for this Ministry. If you can be part of our team, please let me or anyone on Outreach know and we will add you to our mailing list.

Needs at CCAP:

- Men's jeans, sweatshirts, sweatpants, and T-shirts; Women's Spring Clothes; Children's spring clothes, PJs, new underwear, and socks; Tennis Shoes (all sizes and genders); and gently used bath towels and bedding.
- With WATTS closed for the season, CCAP is currently in need of tents, tarps and sleeping bags for our homeless population. Three-man tents are especially needed.
- The Clothing House needs volunteers willing to give 3 hours of their time weekly or monthly. The House supplies free clothing to clients who are struggling to pay all their bills and have money left over for clothes. We also help the homeless with their clothing needs. We receive many wonderful clothing donations and volunteers are needed to sort the items, display them at the House and greet and assist our shoppers. The House is open Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday from 9 until noon.
- Volunteers to sort a large donation from the Mom2Mom Consignment: It takes many hands to sort the tremendous donation we will receive on March 28. Sorting hours will be Monday, March 28 thru Friday, April 9 from 9-2. An hour or two is a big help.

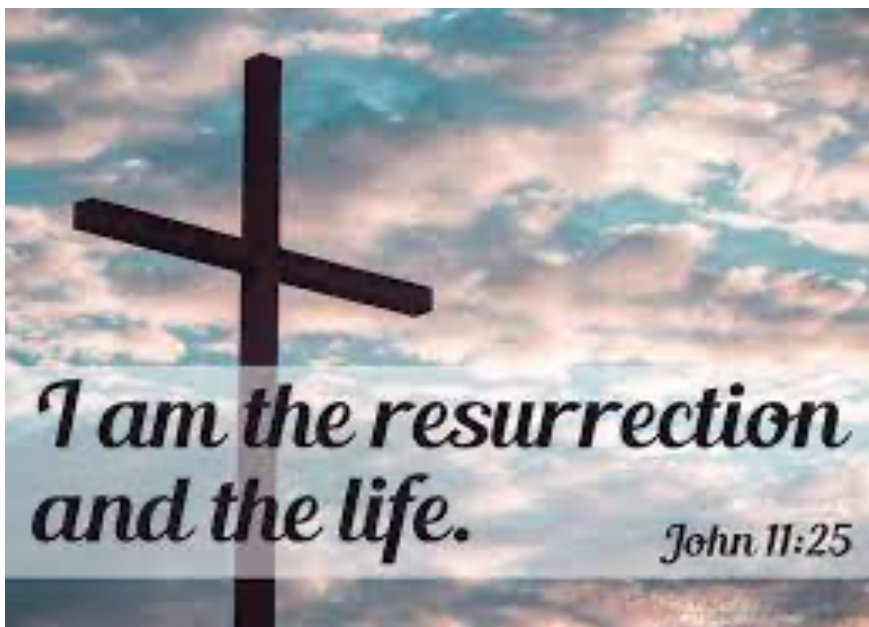
