Pastor's Message

I'm Sorry Lord. I've Fasted & Waited Enough!

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begin on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent is an old Anglo-Saxon word that translates loosely as "Spring."

This church season has been designated as a time of preparation for celebrating Easter. It has traditionally been a time of fasting, repentance, and waiting. It is a more somber season but not completely void of enthusiasm.

During the last two years of the pandemic, the church is well acquainted with fasting and waiting. Fasting and waiting requires patience, reflection, and self-control. I am reminded of Psalm 13 especially in this pandemic year where David writes these words: <u>"Lord, how long must I wait? Will you forget me forever? How long must I struggle with my thoughts? Lord my God, look at me and answer me. Give me new life, or I will die ...... But I trust your faithful love. My heart is filled with joy because you will save me. I will sing praise to the Lord. He has been good to me." NIRV</u>

We have been fasting and waiting for two years! At times over the last 24 months, we have fasted from congregating, we have fasted from eating together, we have fasted from visiting, shaking hands and hugging. We have fasted from the sacraments and especially Holy Communion. We have fasted from Sunday School

and fellowship. We have fasted from mission trips. We have fasted from seeing each other's faces. We have fasted from the joy of watching all the wonderful children in our congregation grow up over the last two years. We have fasted and waited for the return to normalcy. To tell you the truth, I'm tired of fasting and waiting! We have already given up so much over the last two years, I don't feel like giving up anymore! I have reflected enough! I still need to repent, but other than that Lord, I'm sorry, I've got no fasting and waiting left in my heart! Yet, I know what our Lord prayed in the garden and will be obedient.

## "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."

The cup that is COVID 19 will not defeat us! The cup that we have all had to endure will not steal our joy or diminish our hope! The cup that is the Pandemic, will not have victory over the church! Lord, forgive us and give us strength, courage, resolve and an extra measure of faith as we enter into the Lenten season of 2022. This Lenten season, I will continue to pray every day and every night. I will continue to give and serve. I will continue to be present in my church. I will continue to give witness to the truth, mercy, hope, grace, and love of Jesus. I will continue to fulfill my call to the best of my ability. I will repent and I will wait, and I will fast!



#### March 2022 Faith Community Nurse Article

#### The Red Cross needs you to please <u>ROLL UP YOUR SLEEVE</u>

The American Red Cross is facing a national blood crisis, its worst shortage in over a decade. This shortage is forcing doctors to decide which patients receive blood transfusions and which ones must wait. Blood and platelet donations are critically needed to help prevent further delays in vital medical treatments.

The Red Cross has experienced a 10% decline in the number of people donating blood since the beginning of the pandemic and continues to confront relentless issues due to the pandemic, including ongoing blood drive cancellations and staffing limitations.

Each Red Cross blood drive and donation center follows the highest standards of safety and infection control. Individuals who have received a COVID-19 vaccine are still eligible to donate blood and platelets. Knowing the name of the manufacturer of the vaccine they received is important in determining blood donation eligibility.

One of the most important ways to support the Red Cross is to roll up a sleeve to help ensure people receive the care they need. Make an appointment to give blood or platelets as soon as possible by using the Red Cross Blood Donor App, visiting RedCrossBlood.org or calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767). Donors can complete pre-reading material and donor health history questions BEFORE coming to the blood drive. This can reduce donation time by at least 15 minutes. More information is available on redcrossblood.org/RapidPass.

CCAP, the Congregational-Community Action Project, is a cooperative ministry of area churches and one synagogue serving Winchester and Frederick County that have joined together to provide financial, material, and supportive assistance to people in need. CCAP is located at 112 and 106 S. Kent Street.

**Our next CCAP collection will be for the EASTER FOOD GIVEAWAY**. We are no longer collecting Easter Baskets as we have in the past. The CCAP Board feels that people are more in need of food; however, the food baskets will include items for Kid's baskets. Our church has been asked to provide canned green beans, boxed potatoes and gravy packets or cans (no glass please) for the food baskets. These items can be dropped off in the collection bins through Sunday, March 20<sup>th</sup>.

**Food Box packing Team** – Our team spends about 2 hours on Tuesday nights packing food boxes for the Pantry. These boxes are key to feeding our CCAP families. In December, 443 families were served using our boxes along with other items. Two other churches have now joined in this mission; we are now packing just two Tuesdays a month. If you would like to be part of our team, please let me or anyone on Outreach know and we will add you to our mailing list.

#### **Volunteer Opportunities:**

Drivers are needed to pick up food at local stores. Food is picked up Mon-Thurs and Sat from 8-11am. We are hoping to extend the Pantry hours to better serve our clients. To do this, we need volunteers in the Pantry from 8:30 to 2:30 Monday – Friday. Volunteers are also needed in Finance and Reception. We are always looking for volunteers to help in the clothing area. Kathy Dixon, Cheryl Jones, Penny Croll and I currently work in Clothing.

In March, we will be receiving large donations from the Rhea Lana and Mom2Mom consignments. Volunteers will be needed to sort these donations. The donations we receive are wonderful. This is a fun time to meet other volunteers. Sorting will be done 3/8 - 3/17 from 9-2 and again on 3/28 - 4/7 from 9-2. Any hours you could spend here would be greatly appreciated.

## A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This March will mark the two-year anniversary of the pandemic. Burnt Factory UMC has weathered the storm of COVID very well. We have not experienced an outbreak. Our attendance (including live stream) has been good only experiencing a 20% decline from mid-March of 2020. Our giving and mission output has been tremendous. The latest variant has certainly been very contagious and many of our congregation members have been sick. I was able to dodge the virus for 22 months even after being exposed several times and getting tested many times. My family finally succumbed to the omicron variant but weathered the virus with minor symptoms for the most part. I thank God we were fully vaccinated for I believe it would have been a very different experience without it.

It has become obvious, at least to me, that this virus will not be eradicated. It is something we hopefully will be better able to fight with the advent of new medications and treatments that are being developed. We also are hopeful that more people will come to understand the importance in being fully vaccinated. One thing is for sure, vaccinations keep the vast majority of people out of the hospital (not taxing our health care system) and more importantly, out of the funeral home. These statistics are not political and not biased. They are without dispute. The HCT has prayed and discerned how best to move forward at BFUMC and believe the time is now to initiate a mask optional protocol for all the congregation. This will come with the following recommendations, encouragements, and direction.

- BFUMC will no longer requires face coverings. They will be optional for all the congregation. Many people will
  still choose to wear face coverings regardless of their vaccination status and we will still encourage the use of
  face coverings. It is not the churches intent to make anyone feel isolated, judged, guilty or set apart. Our desire
  has always been to keep people safe. We encourage everyone who feels more secure and safe with a face
  covering to continue to wear one. Everyone who needs to wear a face covering to protect themselves and
  others should continue to wear one for everyone's safety.
- The Global/Universal United Methodist Church, including BFUMC, strongly continue to encourage vaccinations and boosters. We realize that even with vaccinations, those with compromising health issues can experience serious illness and will need to continue to take necessary pre-cautions.
- BFUMC encourages those who are sick with flu or cold symptoms on Sunday mornings to stay home, watch the service online, and get well. We encourage the continued use of hand sanitizers and hand washing. We encourage those who are not comfortable with engaging in certain acts of worship and fellowship to make decisions that are best for them.
