From a branch on the Vine,

What do you know about Ephesus? Planning a Summer trip there? It is a forgotten city in modern day Turkey, but it once was a city to rival ancient Rome. As a major trade port where East met West, this ancient city was the home of the Temple of Artemis (Diana), one of the wonders of the ancient world, and it holds much meaning for Christians.

Catholic legend believes this was the last earthly place of the Virgin Mary. The Apostle John pastored there. Timothy was Bishop there. It was mentioned in Revelation as the church who had forgotten their first love. And it was where the Apostle Paul stayed longer than any other place on his

missionary journeys. Paul loved the church in Ephesus and, while in chains in a prison in Rome, wrote them, and the surrounding churches, a letter about being in the family of God and a follower of Jesus Christ.

Many know of Ephesians from chapter 2: ⁸ For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— ⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰ For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. Or, from putting on the Armor of God from Chapter 6 (thank you Vacation Bible School); but don't miss the rest of the story. After the greeting, Paul wanted the churches then and now to know the character of God. He chose us and adopted us.

⁴ For he **chose** us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love ⁵ he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will—

You should get a little tingle in your soul! The God who created Heaven and Earth picked you as the one He wants in his family and heir to all that He has created. Whatever your current situation or your past mistakes, God chose you and changed your identity from earthly to heavenly, from mortal to immortal, from perishable to imperishable. He did it because He loves you – not what you did or didn't do. No, in spite of what you did or didn't do. That's who God is.


So, you are in God's family, on His team. Are you holy? What does being "holy" mean? To the Pharisees it was strict adherence to law and tradition. "I will do so God will love me and others will honor me". Works do not endear us to God; He loves us already. His love does not depend on our actions – Thank you, Jesus. "Holy" means set apart/ different like Sunday is set apart from the other days of the week; like churches and cemeteries are set apart as holy ground. When someone meets you, do they know you are set apart – holy? Are you identifiable as a Christian – set apart to do good works as a response of gratitude to God for His saving grace?

Jesus said in John 15:16, You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.

Accept the Good News and share the Good news. You are sharing the story of your Father and your Brother, Jesus.

⁹ If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. ¹¹ As Scripture says, "Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame" (from the prophet Isaiah). ¹² For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, ¹³ for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." (from the prophet Joel).

President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation on September 22, 1862. It was not until June 19, 1865, that all slaves were finally freed. That concluding event was when General Gordon Granger rode into Galveston, Texas with his troops and issued Order Number 3 which finally freed the last of the slaves. The formal end of slavery was marked by the passing of the 13th amendment of the constitution.

D day is solemnly observed on June 6. On this historic day in 1944, Allied troops invaded the beaches



of Normandy, France. It is the largest amphibious assault in world history. This massive, bloody battle was the turning point of the war in the European theater.

On this day, 156,000 troops from the United States, Great Britain and Canada stormed five beaches. American troops landed on Omaha and Utah beach. At the same time, British troops landed on Gold and Sword beach. And, Canadian forces landed on Juno Beach. 4,000 Allied troops

died on these beaches on D-Day, 2,000 of them were American.


