



CCAP Corner November 2023

CCAP is a cooperative effort of individuals, civic groups, businesses, and religious communities in Winchester and Frederick County. They have unified to provide financial, material, and supportive assistance in a loving way. Even with the help of existing social service programs, CCAP clients are unable to meet their needs and responsibilities. CCAP's desire is to do God's work in a world where many basic human needs are simply not met.

Collections for CCAP at Burnt Factory UMC – November is a busy month for CCAP collections! We will continue our traditional giving to CCAP as follows:

- We are currently collecting **food for the Thanksgiving giveaway** being held Nov.18 at CCAP. We will supply 20 complete meals including a turkey or ham.
- Diapers for the Red Wagon Ministry and Blankets for CCAP Healing Service on 11/15 and Sunday, Nov. 19 – We will collect diapers for the Red Wagon ministry and blankets for CCAP at both of these services. Diaper sizes 4, 5, and 6 are the most needed. Requested blanket sizes are Full and Queen.

Report from CCAP quarterly Representative/Board Mtg held in October: Andrea Cosans, the Exec Director at CCAP, reported the completion of some **major property improvements** that were recommended by a building inspector last year. Fundraising was done to cover these costs. These improvements include:

- foundation/termite damage at the Clothing House has been fixed,
- lighting throughout both buildings has been upgraded,
- HVAC work was done in the main building at **<u>no cost</u>** by Farrells. Thank you Farrells!!
- Gutter Work is still being planned to divert water away from the buildings.

In addition to these improvements, the Pantry Manager has gotten donations of coolers and shelving.

TWO Friendly Neighborhood FREEDGES: The original at 419 N Cameron St and the newest at 700 Aylor Rd at Abundant Life Church are open **24 hours a day**!! These are intended to serve low-income residents. Items needed: Fresh fruits and vegetables, granola, cheese, prepackaged sandwiches, garden foods, and yogurt. You can drop off your food at **any time**.

Current Needs at CCAP:

- **Interpreters** are needed Monday thru Friday from 9-1. If you're trying to learn a second language or are comfortable using the Google Translate on your phone, come on down and hone your skills helping narrow the communication gap between our clients and volunteers.
- Volunteers are needed in the Clothing House Monday, Tuesday and Thursday mornings. The House is open 9-12 on those days.
- **Donation pick-up drivers** are needed to assist with produce and goods pickups from our local stores (Sheetz, Martins, Walmart, Target, Dollar General, Starbucks). The pickup runs are made Monday thru Saturday from 8-11am.

Donations needed: (donations can be dropped off Mon-Fri from 9-2 at 112 S Kent St.)

- Gently used Fall/Winter clothes, coats, hats gloves and shoes in men, women, and children's sizes.
- Men's belts and Women's purses.
- Men's jeans, men's t-shirts, women and men's sweatpants/sweatshirts.
- New women's, men's and children's socks and underwear and Men's white T-Shirts.
- Gently used blankets, sheets and towels.
- Adult Backpacks
