## The Surprising Importance of Saliva

Saliva is made by several salivary glands in the mouth. It consists mostly of water (about 99%). It can contain over 1,000 different types of proteins and other molecules. Saliva or spit has many important roles. It helps to moisten food making it easier to swallow. It contains proteins that help break down food and begin the digestion process. Saliva also includes minerals that can strengthen teeth and prevent decay. It also contains antibodies that help to block and help keep your mouth clean and healthy.

Saliva can also give clues to your health. Saliva tests can quickly detect certain infections, like HIV or COVID-19, with no need for needles to draw blood for testing.

We don't think about saliva very often, but it's always a part of our lives. When we're healthy, we're producing saliva all the time. It even plays a role in our ability to communicate. When we talk, our lips, tongue, and teeth all move in ways that depend on having moisture in the mouth. Saliva is usually taken for granted, but problems can arise if you have too little, or even too much.

If you don't have enough saliva, it's a condition called dry mouth or xerostomia (pronounced ZEER-oh-STOH-mee-ah). It can be caused by a decrease in how much saliva you produce or by changes in your saliva's makeup that make it feel different.

Dry mouth can simply be a nuisance, arising if you're dehydrate, stressed, or while taking certain medications. If it lingers, it can have a major impact on your quality of life and overall health. It can make swallowing difficult and reduce your ability to taste and enjoy food. Dry mouth can also make it hard to chew and speak. Dry mouth can have several causes. Many medications have side effects that can reduce saliva flow. Certain cancer treatments can harm the salivary glands. Some medical conditions can trigger dry mouth too. These include diabetes, AIDS, and a disorder call Sjogren's (pronounced SHOW-grins) syndrome.

Sjogren's disease damages the glands that make saliva and tears, which leads to dry mouth and dry eyes. It can be hard to diagnose because its symptoms vary, depending on the cause.

If you have concerns related to saliva and your mouth, it's important to talk with your health care provider. Salivary symptoms can be early signs of disease, so it's worthwhile to bring up. It's important to be mindful of your saliva and oral health.

The following are ways to ease dry mouth symptoms:

- Drink plenty of water
- Chew sugarless gum or suck on sugarless hard candy to trigger saliva flow
- Avoid tobacco, alcohol and drinks with caffeine. They can dry out the mouth.
- Sip water or a sugarless drink during meals to make chewing and swallowing easier.
- Use a humidifier at night
- Talk with your doctor or dentist if the symptoms don't go away

#### Thank you from our second Afghan refugee family!

During January and February many from the congregation donated money and household items for which the refugee family that arrived in Winchester on January 3 is incredibly grateful. They express their deep appreciation to each of you!! They feel welcomed and we were able to meet many of their initial needs.

The final tally shows giving of \$2250 of which \$250 was given to the family for immediate needs, and the remainder was used to purchase a washer and dryer, rugs for the first floor living areas, privacy curtains and a bike/lock/helmet which is used to get to work.

Other donations included a Chromebook, a television, a rug for upstairs, an electric pressure cooker, a crockpot, 2 large door mats, winter jackets, hats, gloves, scarves, (the boys arrived in t-shirts), lots of paper towels and toilet paper, dish and laundry detergent, a laundry basket, a microwave oven, a vacuum, an end table and a couch.

The family is settling in quite well. The father and 20 year old son have started work and the two younger children are at Handley High School. They also have the benefit of our initial Afghan family helping them to adjust to life in the U.S. (the two fathers are brothers and they were neighbors in Afghanistan). Both families are incredibly grateful to Burnt Factory Church for showing them God's love  $\heartsuit$ . Well done good and faithful servants!!

## **Mission Trip Opportunity!**

Burnt Factory Church will be sending another mission team to Delaware County/Philadelphia PA April 7-12, 2024. We are working through United Methodist Volunteers in Mission (UMVIM) and their local affiliate Project Restoration. This particular area on the southwestern side of Philadelphia was hit by flood waters during Hurricane Ida in September 2021. Two and a half years later many families are still waiting for assistance. Project Restoration is reaching out to people that are unable to afford to repair their own homes. Most had homeowners insurance but many found that it didn't cover flooding. And lots of those being served are elderly, disabled or widows.

Team members do not need any particular skills to serve...just a willing heart. Serving may include listening and supporting family members, cleaning and sorting, demolition, installing floors, drywall, painting, electrical, plumbing, runs to Lowes, cooking for the team etc.
