Peace and Civility Pledge

The church can offer a message of hope and reconciliation to a nation that is hurting and deeply divided. We urge those who claim the name of Christ to "put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you" Ephesians 4:31-32.

We pledge to God and to each other that we will lead by example in a country where <u>civil discourse</u> and <u>peacemaking</u> are rare. We will work to model a better way in how we treat each other in our many communities, across religious and political lines. We will strive to create safe and sacred spaces for common prayer and community discussion as we come together to seek God's will for our nation and our world.

- 1. We believe Jesus' teaching that "Blessed are those who make peace" Matthew 5:9. We acknowledge that most of us have been guilty of violence in our hearts and with our tongues. We hold ourselves to the higher standard to which Christ called us: to refrain from not only physical violence but violence of the heart and tongue. "Do not commit murder. Anyone who murders will be judged for it," and "Do not be angry with your brother or sister" Matthew 5:22-23.
- 2. We commit that our dialogue with each other will reflect the spirit of the scriptures, which tell us, in relating to each other, to be "quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry" James 1:19.
- 3. We believe that each of us, and our fellow human beings, are created in the image of God. This belief should be reflected in the honor and respect we show to each other, particularly in how we speak. "With the tongue we bless the Lord and [Creator], and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God ... this ought not to be so" James 3:9-10.
- 4. We pledge that when we disagree, <u>we will do so respectfully</u>, without falsely impugning the other's motives, attacking the other's character, or questioning the other's faith. We will be mindful of our language, being neither arrogant nor boastful in our beliefs as we strive to "be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love" <u>Ephesians 4:2</u>.
- 5. We recognize that we cannot function together as citizens of the same community, whether local or national, unless we are mindful of how we treat each other. Each of us must therefore "put off falsehood and speak truthfully to his neighbor, for we are all members of one body" Ephesians 4:25.
- 6. We commit to pray for our political leaders those with whom we agree or disagree. "I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for kings and all who are in high positions" 1 Timothy 2:1-2.
- 7. We believe that it is more difficult to hate others, even adversaries and enemies, when we are praying for them. We commit to pray for each other, those with whom we agree and those with whom we may disagree, so that we may be faithful witnesses to our Lord, who prayed "that they may be one" John 17:22.

International Overdose Awareness Day is held every year on **August 31** every year. It is the world's largest campaign to end overdose, to remember without stigma those who have died and to acknowledge the grief of the family and friends left behind.

The theme for 2024 is "**Together We Can**", highlighting the power of community when we all stand together.

Opioids is an umbrella term for natural or synthetic drugs that are derived from or related to – the opium poppy. Opioids attach to receptors in the central nervous system, reducing pain signals to the brain. Commonly used opioids include oxycodone, morphine, codeine, heroin, fentanyl, methadone and opium.

Opioids dull the senses, cause relaxation and euphoria, and slow down breathing and heart rate. In high dose, opioids depress the body's natural urge to breathe.

Signs of Overdose can include:

- · No response to stimuli
- Shallow/stopped breathing
 - Can't be woken up
- Unusual snoring/gurgling sounds
 - Blue/gray lips or fingertips
 - Floppy arms and legs

It can take hours for someone to die from an opioid overdose. Acting as quickly as possible could save a life. Check for alertness, breathing and color. If you see any of these signs, you should act immediately to activate a response plan.

August 2024 Faith and Health Corner Cont'd

- · Before you act, check for dangers like needles.
- Call 911
- Try to get a response by firmly rubbing your knuckles across their sternum
- If you can't get a response:
 - Place the arm nearest to you at a right angle to their body and place their other hand against their check.
 - Pull the leg on top by the knee and pull it up, keeping their foot flat on the ground so that they are laying on their side.
- Do NOT leave the person alone. Do NOT give the person anything to eat or drink.

The Believer's – Helping Hands Cancer Outreach, will be having a bake sale at the Frederick County Fair from July 29 thru August 3rd. We resumed our Family Promise Meals on July 21st with the delivery of 65 fried chicken dinners. Extra fruit, baked macaroni and cheese and coleslaw was dropped off at the Montague Avenue Freedge to a couple of thankful recipients!

We continue our *Mission Spotlight* series this month with **The Laurel Center.**

Founded in 1981 as The Shelter for Abused Women, The Laurel Center has been providing emergency shelter and support services to survivors of domestic and sexual violence and their dependents for the last 40 years. In 2007, the Shelter changed its name to The Laurel Center to reflect a more hopeful and inclusive organization.

Over the years, the Center has created innovative programs and partnerships to protect victims of abuse. In 1991 it was the first in Virginia to have a program to change the identities of families whose situations were so dangerous they needed new names and new locations outside Virginia. In the 1990's they instituted programs for stalking victims and a Crisis Intervention Companions Program to provide fast response for victims of sexual assault in partnership with forensic nurses at Winchester Medical Center.







Outreach Team Update Cont'd

The services that the Center provide include: A 24-hour Hotline; Adult Therapy, Child Therapy, Support Groups, Psycho-educational Counseling, Legal Advocacy, Emergency Shelter and Safety Planning. They also help children between the ages of 5 and 17 who have been exposed to domestic violence that include care coordination, individual therapy, educational groups for children who have witnessed violence and Healthy Relationship support groups for teens. All services provided are free and confidential.

In 2023 the Frederick County Sheriff's Office received to 617 domestic violence calls, Winchester City received 189, and Clarke County Sheriff received 98. Not all of these calls resulted in actual physical assaults, but it is sobering to see these numbers and realize that most domestic violence incidents are never reported.

We at Burnt Factory Church take up collections several times a year for items to donate to the Center. We also make a cash donation of \$2,000.00 in January each year. If you would like to learn more about The Laurel Center, you can visit their website at: thelaurelcenter.org.


