Faith is not just a cognitive assent to a set of religious beliefs or doctrines, but a heart-warming experience with God.

On May 24, 1738, Wesley had a pivotal experience at Aldersgate Street in London. On his journal he wrote: "In the evening I went very unwillingly to a society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading Luther's Preface to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was still describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation, and an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

Methodism is about having a spiritual relationship with the living God!

Do you have your life message or testimony that you can confidently share with others?

Do you have an assurance of salvation? Have you received the Holy Spirit?

God always takes the initiative in reaching out to us and working through our lives. When we respond to God's call, we come to experience a new future!





#### **NEW MINISTRY!!!**



#### **Youth Class**


The Youth meet in the Youth cottage. They are studying "13 Most Important Lessons in the Bible". This is a diverse teaching class with skits, discussion, and crafts.

#### (2a) Circle K Exxon, <u>970 US-211</u>, <u>Luray</u>, <u>VA 22835</u>

- This stop is optional. We will stop here only if riders need gas and can't make it to Front Royal without refueling.
- Mileage from Ruritan Club: 69 mi
- Mileage from Fort Valley Country Store: 24 mi
- Mileage from Cooters: 3 mi

- Mileage from Front Royal Sheetz: 30 mi

- Mileage from Ruritan Club: 126 mi

We will only stop at the Circle K Exxon (stop 2a) if any of the riders need gas. This is due to there not being any large gas stations between Luray and Front Royal. This will also accommodate bikes that have smaller tanks that didn't (or forgot to) get gas at the Fort Valley Country Store.
