



There is a great opportunity this month to come and learn all about our Outreach Programs & Ministries. Carrie Fair is organizing The Ministry Fair which will be held on February 9th in the Fellowship Hall. Our volunteer leaders will be there with displays to discuss each of their special areas of outreach & ministry. If you are led to be involved in Outreach or would just like to find out about what we do, please make plans to attend. All are welcome!

We continue our spotlight series this month with the Helping Hands Cancer Outreach organization. The Believers, led by Theresa Gilbert, are focusing their fund-raising efforts on assisting this group.

Helping Hands provides financial assistance to people in our local community affected by cancer. They serve; Winchester/Frederick County, Front Royal/Warren County, Page County, Shenandoah County, Clarke County, and Fauquier County.

The mission of the organization is to help relieve the financial burden on cancer patients and their families resulting from medical costs. Not having to worry over costs allows patients to relax during treatment.

Assistance paying funeral expenses is also available for those who have lost a loved one to cancer.

Helping Hands provides help with rent/mortgage payments, car payments, gas & grocery cards as well as funeral costs.

In 2024, the Believers sponsored a bake sale and a motorcycle ride that earned over \$2,000.00 for the cause.

CCAP Corner

February 2025

CCAP Mission: Guided by our faith in God and love of neighbor, CCAP is a community lifeline for all people in our area who find themselves struggling to meet basic needs, providing stability and security while enabling them to find paths to self-sufficiency.

A few *CCAP statistics from 2024*: The Clothing House and Baby Toddler Room served 7,061 households with over 165,000 items of clothing and 77,207 diapers distributed. Food in the amount of \$938,275 was distributed at the Main Building. 1081 households and 3229 individuals were assisted with water, electric and rent. Firewood was delivered to 50 households and 120 individuals. Volunteers have been wonderful and have graciously worked approximately 16,659 hours. CCAP's Executive Director, Andrea Cosans, called 2024 the Year of Partnership, with CCAP working with other organizations. Beginning in November, CCAP is partnering monthly with Goodwill, ARE, Sinclair Health Clinic, and Winchester and Frederick Co Social Services for Horizon Goodwill Mobile Health Hub. The Hub is held at CCAP on the last Wednesday of the month. The Hub offers free health Screenings, Housing Navigation and Workforce Development and help with applying for SNAP, Medicaid, Insurance Benefits and TANF. Health Hub is designed to get people into the system to meet their needs, including housing for the homeless. 67 people attended the first Health Hub in November. Another partnership with The Food Bank and United Way is collaborating to get more fresh fruit and veggies to Food Distribution locations.

Our next CCAP collection will be for the EASTER FOOD GIVEAWAY. We will be collecting items for the Easter food boxes to be given away on Saturday, 4/12 at CCAP. Signup sheets for items needed will be in the Fellowship Hall Sunday, 3/2 and 3/9. Items other than the meat should be delivered to the Red CCAP bins in the Narthex by Sunday, 3/30. Meat items can be left in the kitchen at the church.

<u>Opportunities to Serve</u> – There are many ways to volunteer your time at CCAP. Go to www.ccapwinchester.org and click on the donate/volunteer tab at the top of the page for a description of the many opportunities to share your talents and time. You can also reach out to me or anyone on the Outreach Team if you have any questions about what we do as volunteers.

Three Friendly Neighborhood FREEDGEs: (1) - 419 N Cameron St; (2) - 700 Aylor Rd at Abundant Life Church; (3) – 102 Montague Av at Montague Ave Methodist Church. All are open 24 hours a day!! These are intended to serve low-income residents. Items needed: Fresh fruits and vegetables, granola, cheese, soups, prepackaged sandwiches, garden foods, and yogurt. Please label and date your items.

<u>Donations needed</u>: Men's thermals (LG and XLG); Men's New Underwear (M, L, XL, and 2XL); Men's New white socks; Men's and Women's gently used jeans in smaller sizes. Gently used Linens including bedsheets, pillowcases, blankets and towels; adult backpacks and personal hygiene items. All donations may be dropped off Monday – Friday from 10am-1pm at 212 S Kent St. Winchester.


