

### Flu Season 2025

The current flu season is shaping up to be the worst in more than a decade. So far, there have been at least 29 million illnesses and 370,000 hospitalizations related to the flu. There have also been at least 16,000 deaths caused by the flu, according to the CDC.

The following are a few reasons why the CDC feels that this season has been so bad:

- Some of it may be some lingering effects from the COVID pandemic, in that folks are just starting to be out and about more and spreading more communicable diseases.
- The flu is peaking late this year, so it feels like it's dragging out the winter season.

The CDC feels that the flu season has now reached its peak, and that cases should start subsiding soon. In the meantime here are some ways that you can prevent the flu is addition to getting your flu shot (IT'S NOT TOO LATE!):

- Wash your hands! Use soap, water and friction and wash your hands for as long as it takes to say The Lord's Prayer. Viruses and bacteria are spread primarily by hand to hand contact.
- Don't touch your face. The only way those germs get to your face is if you put them there.
- Don't stop sneezes and coughs with your hands. Use a tissue and then throw it away or cough into your sleeve.
- Drink plenty of fluids, especially water, to keep hydrated and flush out toxins.
- Get aerobic exercise it enhances the immune system.

- Don't smoke it zaps the immune system, dries out the nasal passages and paralyzes the cilia that clean the respiratory system.
- Get plenty of rest! Relax and do things you enjoy.
- If you feel ill with a cough, fever, headache, achy joints, etc. do yourself and your coworkers a favor: STAY HOME!

People who get prompt treatment for the flu, which can now include antiviral drugs are likely to shorten their illness. If you think you have the flu, if you test positive for the flu it is best to get started on treatment within the first 48 hours.




