This is an article I shared with the church from <u>April of 2016</u>. It was Easter time. I think it speaks to us today. I'm sharing just a part of the letter. It seems to me that absolutely nothing has changed.

Friends, instead of providing the usual spring newsletter article espousing the wonderful metaphors of new life and the appropriate truths of Easter, I opted to write a commentary. I hope you will receive it in the spirit it is intended and that it will perhaps challenge you. It is entitled:

#### "The Architect of Disunity and Schism"

"How good and pleasant it is when brothers live together in unity." Psalm 133:1

It seems that in today's world everywhere one looks is a spirit of disunity. It seems, at least to this pastor, that the secular and especially the political world has become so polarized that it may never find the ability to enter into positive civil discourse again. Entitlement seems to be the battle cry of everybody in today's world.

"It's my way or the highway" is the mantra. It's what I want --- and what I see as right --- and what I think that matters --- so the slogans of our present leaders of both political parties might as well be: "get out of my way or else" or "shut up" or "I'll get you back if you mess with me" or "I'm not accountable" or " morals, integrity and dignity doesn't matter, as long as you get the job done"

- Compromise --- forget it!
- Negotiate for the good of everybody --- you have got to be kidding!
- Find common ground ---- get out of town!
- Agree to disagree for the benefit of the bigger picture --- no way!
- Use common sense --- what a joke!

"IT'S ABOUT ME!" "IT'S ABOUT ME!" "IT'S ABOUT ME!"

This is not just a truth in our political system but also among the secular world in general and dare I say it --- could this mantra have ever so sinisterly crept into the church?

Nothing epitomizes this secular sense of entitlement more than what happened in the town of Orange, Connecticut over last weekend. It seems that an Easter egg hunt (Yes, I said An Easter egg hunt) that was sponsored by a local candy company went horribly wrong! The event was well planned and the rules communicated in a precise manner. All to no avail when parents, wanting their kiddos to have the most eggs and to make sure (by golly) that they got "What they deserved and was entitled to" rushed the field where the eggs were disbursed in a frenzy of mass chaos; ignoring the rules, let alone, common decency. The event organizer said, "We sincerely tried our best to create a fun, free activity for everyone to enjoy." "Everyone just rushed the field and took everything. --- the crowd was kind of like locusts." We now live in an environment where even an Easter egg hunt is not safe!

"I appeal to you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another so that there may be no divisions among you and that you may be perfectly united in mind and thought." 1st Corinthians 1: 10

The church may be in schism, and it may be in decline in places where it used to be strong. But the church has survived schism before, and it will survive schism again. As for the church, I am absolutely and unequivocally sure of this --- it will never pass away!

"And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it." Matthew 16:18

Jesus established the church, and he established it not in huge temples and among the elite & not in cathedrals and among posh neighborhoods and not in prosperity and abundance.

He didn't establish it with the blessing of politicians or with the partnership of earthly kings.

Jesus established his church among the poor and ordinary. He established his church in the homes of those who were living under persecution --- and guess what? Those places today are where the church is growing! Those places: places where the leaders of their countries are godless and where there is persecution and hatred --- and where there is poverty and humility --- this is where Christianity is flourishing! The one true apostolic church of Jesus Christ is not going away --- no matter how much disunity Satan tries to establish.

I am encouraged by your faithful discipleship and by your willingness to continue the good fight and run the good race! Burnt Factory UMC [now Burnt Factory Church] is growing and thriving and even in the midst of a stressful and transitional time you have not allowed Satan to creep in and divide!

Even with the reality, that we do not all agree with each other on hot point topics politically and denominationally --- you have not disintegrated into camps! I am encouraged because you have not succumbed to the "my way or the highway" thinking! Yes, I am encouraged because you are still a missional church who cares more about others than yourselves! You continue to be radically generous and prayerful. You continue to advance your discipleship with your presence, service, and witness! God bless you all!


